Asset Management, Funding on Agenda for Saskatchewan's West Central Hometowns

Municipal leaders from 13 hometowns in west central Saskatchewan gathered in Cut Knife October 3 to discuss the matters important to their communities.

The topics of asset management and funding dominated the conversation at the West Central Regional Meeting hosted by the Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA).

“Our hometowns are responsible for the infrastructure and services that residents rely on every day, including clean water, waste removal, and roads,” said Al Heron, West Central Regional Director and mayor of the Town of Eston. “Asset management helps make the most out of this infrastructure in a cost-effective manner.”

Representatives also received updates on topics including cannabis legalization, vehicle for hire regulations, and multi-material recycling.

The West Central Regional Meeting is one of seven regional meetings being hosted by SUMA from September 26 – October 4.

“Regional meetings are an opportunity for municipal officials to discuss challenges and share ideas with fellow leaders from their region,” said SUMA President Gordon Barnhart.
