ADVOCACY UPDATE

Strengthening Partnerships to Kickstart 2026 Advocacy

We continue to explore partnerships with other organizations to increase our reach and further amplify our members' voices.

Last week, SUMA staff met with the **Western Canadian Municipal Associations** (WCMA) to discuss common advocacy concerns among western provinces; the **Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association (SPRA)** to look at shared recreation-related advocacy; and **Jack.org** to look into shared advocacy items related to youth mental health.



Next week, we will also be meeting with the **Agricultural Producers Association of Saskatchewan (APAS)** to see if shared advocacy efforts around agricultural production and processing can be expanded.

Call for Caucus Representative Nominations: Village and Resort Village Caucus West Central and East Central

The **Village and Resort Village caucus** is currently seeking nominations for **two vacant positions: a West Central representative and an East Central representative**.

The core mandate of the Village and Resort Village Caucus is to provide a forum for the management of advocacy topics considered relevant to Saskatchewan towns and villages and resort villages, respectively.

The Caucus role includes the following responsibilities:

- Facilitating the meeting of the Caucus

- Identifying and providing advisory input on advocacy topics relevant to member urban municipalities in your sector
- Prioritizing advocacy topics and contributing to the setting of strategies required to advance the advocacy interests of the Caucus
- Providing input on provincial, federal, and/or collective advocacy topics
- Contributing to SUMA's communication efforts with the interest of keeping sector members informed and engaged

The Village and Resort Village Caucus each meet virtually for approximately 90 minutes on a quarterly basis. Additional participation in events such as the Regional Roadshow and caucus meetings at Convention are also strongly encouraged.

Nominations can be submitted to suma@suma.org. Elections, if required, will take place on January 20, 2026 at the **Virtual SUMA Summit**.

2026 CALL FOR RESOLUTIONS

deadline **JANUARY 31, 2026**

SUMA invites members to **submit resolutions ahead of the 2026 SUMA Convention and Tradeshow in Regina, Saskatchewan, from April 12 to 15**. Resolutions are an important way to bring forward issues confronting urban councils that require action by the provincial or federal government or another agency. Members are encouraged to submit resolutions on anything throughout the year. However, the **deadline for receipt of council resolutions for Convention 2026 is January 31, 2026**.

After concerns were raised by members about late resolutions and the inability for councils to discuss these resolutions in advance, only those late resolutions that are absolutely critical and could not possibly have been submitted early enough to be included in the Convention package will be brought forward, and only then with justification for why it is both urgent and emergent. Any other late resolutions will be considered by the SUMA caucuses after Convention.



Read the Full Call For Resolutions and Learn How to Submit

SUMA's move to a caucus model of governance has resulted in related changes to our resolutions process. While in previous years, we have had a resolutions committee review and recommend

resolutions to our Board of Directors, this function will now be taken on by our sectoral caucuses. **Members should still forward their resolutions to the SUMA office in Regina, but it will be our caucuses that review and make recommendations to the Board as to which resolutions should proceed to the Convention floor.**

The number of proposed resolutions to be voted upon at Convention from each caucus has been limited to two. The caucuses may still choose to work independently on additional resolutions without full membership endorsement (i.e., resolutions that have not been brought forward and passed at Convention).



While this represents a substantial change for our membership, it is meant to emphasize the intent of our Convention resolutions session: to bring additional media and government attention to those resolutions that will best benefit from that attention. Not every resolution requires this level of attention; many are better dealt with internally in discussions between SUMA elected officials or SUMA staff and their counterparts in the provincial and federal government. Members will still retain the ability to bring their concerns forward through resolutions, in addition to many opportunities provided through engaging with your caucus representatives, contacting SUMA staff, or attending our numerous events, including Convention.

Once resolutions have been recommended to the Board by each caucus, the Board will review and provide a package to all members in March 2026.

What You Need to Know:

New Registration System

We're using a new registration system this year called PheedLoop. Things will look a little different on the registration page than previous Conventions, so please follow instructions throughout the process to ensure a smooth experience. We're available for support too!

As always, your municipality will be registered as a group, not as individuals. It is important to assign one person (such as your CAO, administrator, or clerk) to handle the registration process.

A **Registration FAQ email** will be sent out early next week outlining everything you need to know to register.

The main contact for each municipality will receive an email with the link to register. This email will also include a link to book your hotels (see "Hotel Booking" below for more information).

Hotel Booking

SUMA is once again using Resiada to book your hotels. With Resiada, you can view prices for each hotel, see where they are located, check their availability, and book your rooms, all through a single website. To ensure accurate availability, **all accommodations at participating Convention 2026 hotels must be booked through Resiada**.

Hotel booking opens the same day as registration, on January 19, 2026. **There will be a link to access hotel booking included in the registration email.**

Free Access to the Tradeshow

Did you know? **All municipal staff and council members can access the Tradeshow only at no cost.** To do so, you must **register as a Tradeshow Observer** in the Convention registration system when registration opens on January 19.

Resolutions Deadline is January 31

Solid Waste Management Strategy Consultation

The Ministry of Environment is seeking input on the renewal of Saskatchewan's **Solid Waste Management Strategy**.

The Ministry invites you to review the discussion paper and submit your feedback by January 15, 2026. The discussion paper, survey, and contact information are available [here](#).

The Ministry will review all responses and prepare a "What We Heard" report, which will be shared with stakeholders and posted on the Government of Saskatchewan website once completed.

Federal Funding Available to Support BDO Zone Ratings for Your Region

Canadian communities now have an opportunity to access federal funding to enhance their readiness for clean-energy investment. From January 5 to 30, 2026, the [CanExport Community Investments Program](#) will open a new intake that can help subsidize a **BDO Zone Rating** for your region.

A BDO Zone Rating is an independent, internationally recognized assessment that evaluates a region's biomass supply, logistics, and infrastructure to determine its suitability for new biofuel and biomanufacturing facilities. Often described as a **credit rating for biomass development potential**, it provides a trusted signal that helps communities stand out to developers and investors.

BDO Zone Ratings have already supported over \$10 billion in capital being raised for projects in rated regions. Notably, the [\\$845 million Provectus Biofuels plant announced in Vegreville, Alberta](#) in 2025, highlights how an investment grade rating can help attract major investment.

Nominations for the 2025 SK Waste Reduction Awards Are Open

The **SK Waste Reduction Awards** recognize excellence in waste reduction in Saskatchewan. They are intended to promote leadership and inspire all sectors to undertake waste reduction projects. The Saskatchewan Waste Reduction Council (SWRC) hopes not only to provide well-deserved recognition to the winners, but also to highlight success stories for others to follow.

There are two categories for municipalities:

- Municipality (<5,000) — Saskatchewan municipalities with a population under 5,000 who have demonstrated excellence and leadership in waste reduction
- Municipality (>5,000) — Saskatchewan municipalities with a population over 5,000 who have demonstrated excellence and leadership in waste reduction

The deadline for applications is midnight on Saturday, January 31.

The Honourable Maninder Sidhu, Federal Minister of International Trade, recently announced the launch of **public consultations on four free trade agreement negotiations**. Each of these agreements has the potential to create business opportunities and improve market access for Canadian goods and services in several fast-growing economies around the world.

As part of Canada's work to double Canadian exports to non-U.S. markets in the next decade, these agreements will help build stronger and more reliable trade relationships around the world.

Public consultations will help shape Canada's negotiating positions, ensuring benefits are maximized for Canadians by reflecting their specific interests and priorities.

SUMA's Pet Tag and Animal Control Products Program Has Ended

Since 2008, SUMA has provided members with **pet tag and animal control products** from Ketchum Manufacturing Inc. When this program was established, there were limited options for our members to find these types of supplies. SUMA stepped in to provide this program, offering a much-needed service to ensure pets are safely managed in your communities.

In today's online world, there are now many options to order pet tag and animal control products at competitive prices, so SUMA's role in managing this program is no longer needed moving forward.

We discontinued the Ketchum pet tag and animal control products program as of December 31, 2025.



Why the Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Funding Grant Matters

Municipalities often face resource constraints, administrative hurdles, and governance complexities for starting new or costly initiatives beyond normal operations of the municipality. **Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Grant Funding** directly addresses these issues by reviewing applications to fund **75% of these costs** with the intent to:

- **Encourage Inter-Community Collaboration:** Projects must involve at least one partner municipality or community, fostering regional unity and shared solutions.
- **Enhance Governance and Capacity:** Funding supports training, restructuring, and strategic planning that elevates municipal leadership and administration.
- **Drive Innovation in Service Delivery:** From emergency management plans to regional land use strategies, TSS-funded projects improve efficiency and responsiveness.

Each project can receive up to **75% of eligible costs, capped at \$100,000 maximum funding**, making it a high-impact, low-barrier opportunity for municipalities to innovate and grow.

TSS is a portion of Municipal Revenue Sharing (\$1.5 million per fiscal year) used to encourage inter-community collaboration, help build capacity and promote good governance in all Saskatchewan municipalities. The funds are used to support projects that help municipalities strengthen their core governance and administration responsibilities

The TSS Steering Committee is now accepting applications for funding under this program. **Applications are accepted at any time of the year and will be reviewed on a monthly basis.**
