### Broadband Committee Bringing National Conference to Saskatchewan for 2026

The **Saskatchewan Broadband Action Committee (SBAC)** hopes to start conversations around rural connectivity and digital adoption at the **Canadian Rural and Remote Broadband Community (CRRBC) Conference** this coming fall in Saskatoon.

SUMA's CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau and SARM's CEO Laurel Feltin co-chair the SBAC and are looking forward to the conference. "We aim to ensure every individual and business in every Saskatchewan community, no matter how remote, has the communications infrastructure they need now and in the future," commented Nadeau. "Municipal leaders in Saskatchewan are eager for the opportunity to connect with industry leaders and policymakers to share strategies for expanding rural broadband access."

The SBAC is a cross-sector and community-based group of provincial, local, and Indigenous organizations, networks, and service providers aimed at achieving broadband infrastructure parity for all Saskatchewan residents, regardless of location.

## ADVOCACY UPDATE

### Announced Closure of Indian Head Research Farm

SUMA attended a meeting on February 6 opposing Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada's announced closure of the **Indian Head Research Farm**, which has been in existence since 1887. The research site is one of seven research operations slated to be closed.

SUMA joined elected officials from the Town of Indian Head and RM of Indian Head, staff from the research lab, community members, representatives from SARM, and local MPs Andrew Scheer and Steven Bonk.

### Solid Waste Management Strategy Renewal

SUMA recently submitted responses to the provincial consultation **Solid Waste Management Strategy** renewal. We are calling on the government to take proactive action on the advocacy areas we have identified. We believe it is critical that the province fully considers SUMA's recommendations across all strategy pillars before moving toward implementation, to ensure the final framework is both practical and sustainable for all municipalities.

### Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR)

SUMA has formally reached out to **Recycle Saskatchewan** to address the ongoing challenges with the **Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) implementation** and seek clarity on behalf of our members. We have submitted a comprehensive list of the issues you've raised, alongside the specific actions we expect to see to ensure this system works for all municipalities. We are currently waiting for a response.

In the meantime, we have attached our [What We Heard](#) document, which captures the diverse concerns shared by our members.

We invite all members to review this document to see the specific advocacy areas we are pushing forward on your behalf. We are currently working on our next steps and will continue to provide updates.


We look forward to continued conversations with GR to help meet the needs of municipalities.

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## Meeting with Minister of SaskBuilds and Procurement

Last week, SUMA met with the **Honourable Sean Wilson, Minister of SaskBuilds and Procurement**.

We discussed the need for a new tri-party infrastructure program and infrastructure cost overrun protections for municipalities, PST on construction, the need for an Indigenous procurement policy, and our concerns around the Building Schools Faster Legislation.

In 1997, a climbing accident led to the amputation of both of Warren Macdonald's legs. Ten months later, he scaled Tasmania's Cradle Mountain, and in 2003 became the first double above-knee amputee to summit Mt. Kilimanjaro. He's also conquered El Capitan and Alberta's "Weeping Wall." Warren shares his journey in his bestselling book, *A Test of Will*, and documentary, *The Second Step*, and has been featured worldwide.

Jack Lucas is a Professor in the Department of Political Science at the University of Calgary and Co-Director of the Canadian Municipal Barometer, which provides data and insights on municipal democracy, elections, and public opinion. His research focuses on local governance, political representation, and citizen engagement, and he works with partners nationwide to make research accessible and practical for municipal leaders.

His book *Ideology in Canadian Municipal Politics* won the 2024 APSA S. M. Lipset Award for Best Book on Canadian Politics.

#### REGISTRATION FAQ'S FOR MEMBERS

##### BEFORE YOU BEGIN

With a new registration system this year called *PheedLoop*, things will look a little different on the registration page than previous Conventions, so please follow instructions throughout the process to ensure a smooth experience. **We're available for support at registration@suma.sk.**

You'll need to gather details for all attendees from your municipality before you begin the registration process. **IMPORTANT:** You are only able to access the registration system once. You can update your registration any time by logging into the **Attendee Portal**.

Here are the details you'll need to confirm before you start:

##### THE BASICS

- Who is in charge of registration? Your municipality will be registered as a group, not as individuals. It is important to assign one person (such as a CAO, administrator, or clerk) to handle the registration process.
- Who is attending from your municipality? Make sure you have the correct spelling of their names and email addresses. **Note:** Register attendees with an email address they can access during Convention from their phone or laptop—this will be used to log in to the Convention app.
- How many voting delegates are allotted to your municipality, and which council members will have voting privileges?
- Which category will each attendee fall under?
  - Voting delegates
  - Non-voting delegates
  - Municipal employee
  - Tradeshow observer – Municipal employees who will attend the Tradeshow only. Municipal employees can attend the Tradeshow for free but must register as a "Tradeshow observer" in the Convention registration system.
- Will your council members attend in-person or participate online? Make sure you know the preference of each council member you are registering.
- Which education, breakout, and dialogue sessions will each of your registrants attend? See the promotional **2026 Convention Brochure** for more details.
- Are your in-person attendees interested in participating in one of the four optional excursions? See the promotional **2026 Convention Brochure** for more details.
- Will you need additional President's Gala tickets? One ticket to the President's Gala is included with each Convention registration. Additional tickets can be purchased for \$100 per ticket.

## Nominations Open Until March 31: Saskatchewan Protective Services Medal

The annual deadline for the **Saskatchewan Protective Services Medal** nominations is **March 31** of each year. This year, nominations will be accepted for members of your agency or organization with 25 years of exemplary service as of March 31, 2026 (requiring service prior to April 1, 2001).

Nominations are accepted year-round; nominations received after March 31, 2025, are already in the queue for this year – there is no need to re-send a nomination that has already been submitted. Nominations received after March 31, 2026, will be added to next year's queue.

## Why the Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Funding Grant Matters

Municipalities often face resource constraints, administrative hurdles, and governance complexities for starting new or costly initiatives beyond normal operations of the municipality. **Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Grant Funding** directly addresses these issues by reviewing applications to fund **75% of these costs** with the intent to:

- **Encourage Inter-Community Collaboration:** Projects must involve at least one partner municipality or community, fostering regional unity and shared solutions.
- **Enhance Governance and Capacity:** Funding supports training, restructuring, and strategic planning that elevates municipal leadership and administration.
- **Drive Innovation in Service Delivery:** From emergency management plans to regional land use strategies, TSS-funded projects improve efficiency and responsiveness.

Each project can receive up to **75% of eligible costs, capped at \$100,000 maximum funding**, making it a high-impact, low-barrier opportunity for municipalities to innovate and grow.

**TSS** is a portion of Municipal Revenue Sharing (\$1.5 million per fiscal year) used to encourage inter-community collaboration, help build capacity and promote good governance in all Saskatchewan municipalities. The funds are used to support projects that help municipalities strengthen their core governance and administration responsibilities

The TSS Steering Committee is now accepting applications for funding under this program. **Applications are accepted at any time of the year and will be reviewed on a monthly basis.**
