As the Government of Saskatchewan prepared its 2026-2027 Budget, SUMA engaged Ministers last fall with specific concerns from our membership that would require budget allocations.

This was the first year SUMA's caucuses have been active. This gave us the opportunity to have in-depth discussion around the needs of our members in cities, towns, villages and resort villages, and northern municipalities. **Our pre-budget asks are aligned with the priorities of each caucus as well as core issues that SUMA has been advocating for over the past year.**

ADVOCACY UPDATE

Caucus Meetings

The **Northern Caucus** meeting was held on February 27, and the **Town Caucus** meeting was on March 5. Meetings for the **City Caucus** and **Village and Resort Village Caucus** were held earlier in February.

Resolutions Review and Approval

Caucuses have each reviewed their resolutions, and resolutions have been submitted for consideration by the SUMA Board of Directors. **The Board will now review the resolutions for final approval to be presented at Convention in April.**

The **resolutions package** will be available to our members by mid-March for review ahead of Convention.

SUMA Partner Eco-West Bringing \$1 Million in Funding for EV Charging Stations to Saskatchewan

On February 5, the federal government announced its new **Automotive Strategy**, a suite of measures to protect and secure the auto industry while building a globally competitive automotive sector focused on next-generation vehicle manufacturing.

As part of this strategy, the Government of Canada is enhancing electric vehicle charging infrastructure

through investments. This includes \$84.4 million for 122 projects to install more than 8,000 electric vehicle chargers across Canada through the Zero Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Program. **Eco-West Canada received \$1 million of this infrastructure support for the purchase and installation of EV charging stations in Saskatchewan, illustrating the importance of intergovernmental collaboration and recognizing EWC's proven expertise in climate transition and sustainable mobility.**

Through the **Municipal Eco Action Centre**, SUMA is proud to partner with Eco-West Canada to provide services and funding opportunities for SUMA members as they plan, fund, and implement environmental initiatives.

- Simple steps municipalities can take to support co-operatives in their community



REGISTRATION FAQ'S FOR MEMBERS

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

We're using a new registration system this year called **PhaedLoop**. Things will look a little different on the registration page than previous Conventions, so please follow instructions throughout the process to ensure a smooth experience. **We're available for support at registration@suma.org.**

You'll need to gather details for all attendees from your municipality before you begin the registration process. **IMPORTANT:** You are only able to access the registration system **once**. You can update your registration any time by logging into the **Attendee Portal**.

Here are the details you'll need to confirm before you start:

THE BASICS

- Who is in charge of registration? Your municipality will be registered as a group, not as individuals. It is important to assign one person (such as a CAO, administrator, or clerk) to handle the registration process.
- Who is attending from your municipality? Make sure you have the correct spelling of their names and email addresses. **Note:** Register attendees with an email address they can access during Convention from their phone or laptop—this will be used to log in to the Convention app.
- How many voting delegates are allotted to your municipality, and which council members will have voting privileges?
- Which category will each attendee fall under?
 - Voting delegate
 - Non-voting delegate
 - Municipal employee
 - Tradeshow observer—Municipal employees who will attend the Tradeshow only. Municipal employees can attend the Tradeshow for free but must register as a Tradeshow observer in the Convention registration system.
- Will your council members attend in-person or participate online? Make sure you know the preference of each council member you are registering.
- Which education, breakout, and dialogue sessions will each of your registrants attend? See the promotional **2026 Convention Brochure** for more details.
- Are your in-person attendees interested in participating in one of the four optional excursions? See the promotional **2026 Convention Brochure** for more details.

Statistics Canada Hiring in Saskatchewan Communities for 2026 Census

The next **Census of Population** will take place in May 2026. To support this important project, Statistics Canada is hiring for supervisory and non-supervisory positions in Saskatchewan communities.

Census jobs offer flexible, short-term employment and the chance to contribute to data collection activities. Census information is used to plan programs and services that support employment, education, public transportation, and health care. Results from the census help provide high-quality information on key socioeconomic trends and analysis that can support important decisions that affect organizations, businesses, municipalities, governments and Indigenous communities across Canada.

Why the Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Funding Grant Matters

Municipalities often face resource constraints, administrative hurdles, and governance complexities for starting new or costly initiatives beyond normal operations of the municipality. **Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Grant Funding** directly addresses these issues by reviewing applications to fund **75% of these costs** with the intent to:

- **Encourage Inter-Community Collaboration:** Projects must involve at least one partner municipality or community, fostering regional unity and shared solutions.
- **Enhance Governance and Capacity:** Funding supports training, restructuring, and strategic planning that elevates municipal leadership and administration.

- **Drive Innovation in Service Delivery:** From emergency management plans to regional land use strategies, TSS-funded projects improve efficiency and responsiveness.

Each project can receive up to **75% of eligible costs, capped at \$100,000 maximum funding**, making it a high-impact, low-barrier opportunity for municipalities to innovate and grow.

TSS is a portion of Municipal Revenue Sharing (\$1.5 million per fiscal year) used to encourage inter-community collaboration, help build capacity and promote good governance in all Saskatchewan municipalities. The funds are used to support projects that help municipalities strengthen their core governance and administration responsibilities

The TSS Steering Committee is now accepting applications for funding under this program. **Applications are accepted at any time of the year and will be reviewed on a monthly basis.**
