## SUMA Calls for More Support for Urban Municipalities

With the release of the Government of Saskatchewan's 2026-2027 budget, SUMA is pleased to see the Government of Saskatchewan acknowledging the importance of both urban and rural municipalities in our province.

For example, municipalities in Saskatchewan benefit greatly from the Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) program, which recognizes the benefit municipal services, such as policing, fire, and recreation, bring to the province. We are grateful for the Government's continued commitment to MRS and its **record investment of \$392.4 million**, an increase of \$30.7 million from last year's budget.

However, for urban municipalities to deliver the services and public infrastructure their residents and neighbours depend on, **we need to see more equitable funding for municipalities.**

**We believe there to be room for partnerships and growth in the way the provincial government supports urban municipalities, and we look forward to exploring these possibilities.**

We were pleased to attend the **Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities (SARM) Convention** earlier this month.

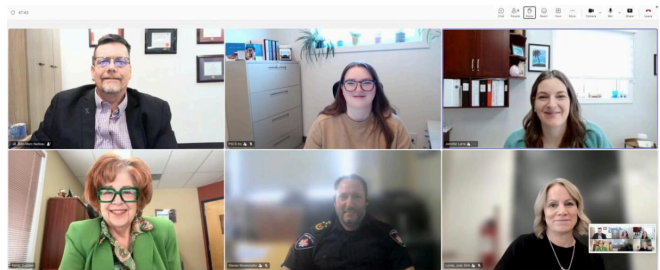
A strong municipal sector relies on collaboration between urban and rural municipalities and their Associations.

### Meeting with Paramedic Services Chiefs of Saskatchewan

## Resolutions at Convention

The SUMA Board of Directors approved 11 resolutions to debate at Convention on **April 13 from 3:45 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.** See the [resolutions package](#) for details on this year's resolutions.

To ensure that councils have an opportunity to discuss all resolutions before voting at Convention, SUMA strictly adheres to our Resolutions Policy regarding the addition of resolutions submitted after the resolution deadline. Only those resolutions that are **absolutely critical and could not possibly have been included in the Convention package** will be brought forward after the January 31 resolution deadline, and only then with justification for why it is both urgent and emergent. Any other late resolutions will be considered by the SUMA Board after Convention.

- Contributing to SUMA's communication efforts with the interest of keeping sector members informed and engaged

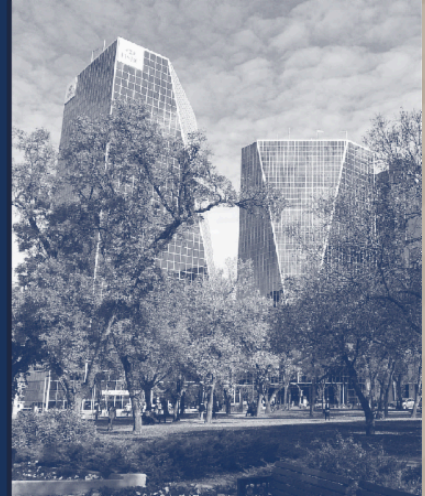



### BEFORE YOU BEGIN

We're using a new registration system this year called **PhreedLoop**. Things will look a little different on the registration page than previous Conventions, so please follow instructions throughout the process to ensure a smooth experience. **We're available for support at [registration@suma.org](mailto:registration@suma.org).**

You'll need to gather details for all attendees from your municipality before you begin the registration process. **IMPORTANT:** You are only able to access the registration system **once**. You can update your registration any time by logging into the **Attendee Portal**.

**Here are the details you'll need to confirm before you start:**

### REGISTRATION FAQ'S FOR MEMBERS

#### THE BASICS

- Who is in charge of registration? Your municipality will be registered as a group, not as individuals. It is important to assign one person (such as a CAO, administrator, or clerk) to handle the registration process.
- Who is attending from your municipality? Make sure you have the correct spelling of their names and email addresses. **Note:** Register attendees with an email address they can access during Convention from their phones or laptop—this will be used to log in to the Convention app.
- How many voting delegates are allotted to your municipality, and which council members will have voting privileges?
- Which category will each attendee fall under?
  - Voting delegates
  - Non-voting delegates
  - Municipal employees
  - Tradeshow observer – Municipal employees who will attend the Tradeshow only. Municipal employees can attend the Tradeshow for free but must register as a Tradeshow observer in the Convention registration system.
- Will your council members attend in-person or participate online? Make sure you know the preference of each council member you are registering.
- Which education, breakout, and dialogue sessions will each of your registrants attend? See the promotional **2026 Convention Brochure** for more details.
- Are your in-person attendees interested in participating in one of the four optional excursions? See the promotional **2026 Convention Brochure** for more details.
- Will you need additional President's Gala tickets? One ticket to the President's Gala is included with each Convention registration. Additional tickets can be purchased for \$100 per ticket.

## Why the Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Funding Grant Matters

Municipalities often face resource constraints, administrative hurdles, and governance complexities for starting new or costly initiatives beyond normal operations of the municipality. **Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Grant Funding** directly addresses these issues by reviewing applications to fund **75% of these costs** with the intent to:

- **Encourage Inter-Community Collaboration:** Projects must involve at least one partner municipality or community, fostering regional unity and shared solutions.
- **Enhance Governance and Capacity:** Funding supports training, restructuring, and strategic planning that elevates municipal leadership and administration.

- **Drive Innovation in Service Delivery:** From emergency management plans to regional land use strategies, TSS-funded projects improve efficiency and responsiveness.

Each project can receive up to **75% of eligible costs, capped at \$100,000 maximum funding**, making it a high-impact, low-barrier opportunity for municipalities to innovate and grow.

**TSS** is a portion of Municipal Revenue Sharing (\$1.5 million per fiscal year) used to encourage inter-community collaboration, help build capacity and promote good governance in all Saskatchewan municipalities. The funds are used to support projects that help municipalities strengthen their core governance and administration responsibilities

The TSS Steering Committee is now accepting applications for funding under this program. **Applications are accepted at any time of the year and will be reviewed on a monthly basis.**
