ADVOCACY UPDATE

Policing Costs for 2025-2026 Announced

The per capita rates to be invoiced to municipalities for the 2025-2026 year have been released by the **Ministry of Corrections, Policing and Public Safety**. Municipalities will see a **2.54 per cent increase** this year.

The 2025-2026 rates are as follows:

- Municipalities with a detachment: \$98.52 (an increase of \$2.44 from 2024-2025)
- Municipalities without a detachment: \$60.95 (an increase of \$1.51 from 2024-2025)

The Police Act section 23.1(2)(b) provides the Ministry with the authority to distribute costs to municipalities, and the formula to calculate a rate payable by municipalities for police services is in section 7.02(1) of *The Police Regulations*. In summary, the percentage increase in the per capita rates is equal to the percentage increase of budget provided to RCMP to fund the Provincial Police Service Agreement (PPSA).

Created in 2003, the goal of the **Railway Association of Canada's (RAC) Proximity Initiative** is to prevent problems from arising between railways and residents. The Accelerated 2-year CEDI Program is a good fit for First Nations and municipalities who have a pre-existing relationship and preliminary ideas for collaborative community economic development initiatives. **Deadline to apply is Friday, May 30th, 2025, 11:59 p.m. MT.**
