# Wildfire State of Emergency

Last week, Premier Scott Moe, in conjunction with the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA), declared a provincial State of Emergency due to the wildfires affecting communities across Saskatchewan.

This declaration provides enhanced powers to the Minister and SPSA that may be required to help address this unprecedented start of the fire season.

The state of emergency will be in effect for 30 days and can be extended if necessary.

The SPSA has committed to providing daily updates on the current wildfire situation to ensure that Saskatchewan residents are provided with the most up to date information.

Anyone who spots a wildfire can call 1-800-667-9660, dial 9-1-1, or contact their closest SPSA Forest Protection Area office.

SUMA extends our support to all of those affected by the devastating wildfires in our province, especially those in our northern municipalities who face threats to their safety, homes, communities, and livelihoods. We know the effects of the fires may be long lasting, and we are here to help advocate for the support you need to recover.

# **ADVOCACY UPDATE**

# **Caucus Meetings Underway**

SUMA's Caucus meetings took place at the end of May for the City Caucus, Town Caucus, and Village/Resort Village Caucus. These were the first meetings of the new governance structure.

The **Cities Caucus** focused discussion on revenue sharing, infrastructure funding, physician recruitment and retention, mental health and addictions, and public safety needs.

The top priority issues identified by the **Towns Caucus** included healthcare, community safety and bylaws, and aging infrastructure.

Infrastructure funding and policing needs dominated conversation at the Village/Resort Village Caucus meeting. The Caucus specifically identified the need for tailored programs for municipal infrastructure funding for smaller communities so they do not have to compete in the same funding pools as larger communities.

# **CEO's Regional Tour**

SUMA CEO, Jean-Marc Nadeau, recently travelled to our **Southwest and Southeast regions** on a regional tour, visiting 15 communities over the course of three days. CEO Nadeau visited a mix of towns and villages, meeting with the Chief Administrative Officer and touring through the community.

He visited the Village of Macoun, Town of Oxbow, Town of Alameda, Town of Bienfait, City of Estevan, Village of Torquay, Town of Radville, Town of Bengough, Town of Coronach, Town of Assiniboia, Town of Lafleche, Town of Gravelbourg, Town of Mossbank, Village of Briercrest, and Town of Pense.

Community discussions focused on topics including regional cooperation, infrastructure achievements and funding, changes to property assessments, administrative and operational struggles facing municipalities, feedback on SUMA's communication, support, and Convention 2025.

"There's no substitute for being on the ground, hearing directly from municipal leaders," said CEO Nadeau. "These visits offer SUMA a firsthand look at the unique challenges, accomplishments, and pressing priorities of our communities. I'm excited to continue these conversations as I visit more regions across the province in the future."

# SUMA Meets with Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, the Honourable Tim Hodgson

Last month SUMA delegates including CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau, Chair of SUMA's City Mayor's Caucus Gerald Aalbers, and Director of Advocacy Sean McKenzie met with the Honourable Tim Hodgson, newly appointed federal Minister of Energy and Natural Resources.

They discussed the landscape of urban municipalities in the province and extending market opportunities for Saskatchewan products.

We look forward to continuing to work with the federal government to advance economic development opportunities for municipalities.

# MuniCast: S8:E4 Accessing Health Services in Saskatchewan

Saskatchewan communities are facing significant challenges in healthcare access, affecting the quality and availability of care for residents. Key findings from recent research reveals gaps in service delivery outside larger urban centers including limited resources, staffing shortages, and geographic barriers. Mental health services face similar struggles, with individuals encountering difficulties in accessing support due to systemic barriers and regional disparities. Tackling these issues requires innovative solutions to improve healthcare access and ensure equitable support for all residents.

In this episode, *Accessing Health Services in Saskatchewan with the University of Regina and the Canadian Mental Health Association*, Advocacy Advisor Kerri Martin, sits down with Dr. Nuelle Novik, Associate Professor in the Faculty of Social Work at the University of Regina, and a researcher with the Saskatchewan Population Health and Evaluation Research Unit (SPHERU), and Rebecca Rackow, Assistant Executive Director and Dave Nelson, Senior Program Consultant, with the Canadian Mental Health Association, to discuss the challenges faced by residents in small and remote communities when accessing healthcare services.

# **Postal Strike: Transition to Online Payments**

With the potential for another postal strike, SUMA encourages all municipalities to transition to online payments.

### How to pay online

To pay SUMA invoices, please set up SUMA as a bill payee with your financial institution.

SUMA is set up as a bill payee with the financial institutions below. *Please note:* We have expanded to more Saskatchewan Credit Unions through Central One Billers, so some municipalities that previously could not find SUMA as a bill payee with their banks may now be able to utilize this option.

Once you find SUMA as a bill payee, you will need to set up two different accounts to pay as follows:

### **SUMA's Group Benefits**

In early December 2024, your office would have received an email communication outlining the option to pay your group benefit premiums online. This message included your unique online account number required to facilitate these payments.

To pay group benefit premiums, the account number will be 8 digits starting with GB###### (e.g., GB123456).

If you do not have your account number, please contact the Group Benefits Department directly.

### General SUMA Invoices

General SUMA invoices include all payments other than Group Benefits premiums, such as membership, VFF, Convention registration, education sessions registration, shipping labels, election and pet supplies, and more.

The account number to pay general SUMA invoices through online banking is found on the bottom right of invoices. It will be an 8-digit number starting with AR####### (e.g., AR123456).

# **Preparing for Wildfire Threats**

The wildfire season in Saskatchewan is off to a devastating start, with many fires threatening SUMA's member municipalities in our northern regions.

There are three ways in which a wildfire can spread to a building:

1. Flying embers blown by wind can land and ignite the structure;

2. Fire can also spread from vegetation directly to the building walls; or

3. The heat generated from a wildfire can cause combustible building components to auto ignite (also known as "radiant heat effect").

Fuels, weather and topography work together to determine how fast or slow a fire will spread. If your premises are located in the proximity of grasslands or wooded areas, you may be at risk.
