#### Wildfire State of Emergency

Premier Scott Moe, in conjunction with the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA), declared a provincial State of Emergency due to the wildfires affecting communities across Saskatchewan.

This declaration provides enhanced powers to the Minister and SPSA that may be required to help address this unprecedented start of the fire season.

The state of emergency will be in effect for 30 days and can be extended if necessary.

The SPSA has committed to providing daily updates on the current wildfire situation to ensure that Saskatchewan residents are provided with the most up to date information.

Anyone who spots a wildfire can call 1-800-667-9660, dial 9-1-1, or contact their closest SPSA Forest Protection Area office.

SUMA extends our support to all of those affected by the devastating wildfires in our province, especially those in our northern municipalities who face threats to their safety, homes, communities, and livelihoods. We know the effects of the fires may be long lasting, and we are here to help advocate for the support you need to recover.

# **ADVOCACY UPDATE**

#### **FCM Convention Updates**

From May 29 to June 1, SUMA President Randy Goulden, City Mayor's Caucus Chair Gerald Aalbers, and CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau attended the Federation of Canadian Municipalities annual conference.

President Goulden was elected chair of the Prairies and Territorial Caucus, in addition to being recognized for fifteen years of service to the FCM Board. FCM's Saskatchewan caucus will consist of mayor Aalbers, councillor Sarah McInnis of Humboldt, and councillor Zach Jeffries of Saskatoon.



Former SARM CEO Ray Orb was also recognized at the event with a spot on FCM's Roll of Honour.

#### Meeting with the Honurable Lori Carr

On Thursday, June 12 SUMA President Randy Goulden met with **Minister of Heath, the Honourable Lori Carr.** 

The meeting was requested by Minister Carr in response to a communication sent regarding the

Saskatchewan Health Authority's Short Term Bed (SSB) policy. The policy states that **patients can be moved from their home communities** when necessary, and that **families are responsible for transportation costs and daily rates.** 

SUMA focused on requesting points of clarity and outlining our position on the policy. It is our position that keeping patients in their home communities and close to their support network is paramount in supporting their health and wellbeing. Additionally, income and ability to cover transportation costs to visit patients should not be a barrier for families.

#### **First Caucus Meetings Held**

SUMA's Caucus meetings took place at the end of May for the City Caucus, Town Caucus, and Village/Resort Village Caucus. These were the first meetings of the new governance structure.

The **Cities Caucus** focused discussion on revenue sharing, infrastructure funding, physician recruitment and retention, mental health and addictions, and public safety needs.

The top priority issues identified by the **Towns Caucus** included healthcare, community safety and bylaws, and aging infrastructure.

Infrastructure funding and policing needs dominated conversation at the Village/Resort Village Caucus meeting. The Caucus specifically identified the need for tailored programs for municipal infrastructure funding for smaller communities so they do not have to compete in the same funding pools as larger communities.

# MuniCast: S8:E5 Reimagining Libraries with Praxis Consulting and the Regina Public Library

Libraries have long been pillars of knowledge, community, and accessibility, but as the world shifts toward digital media and instant information, their role is evolving. In this episode, *Reimagining Libraries*, Director of Advocacy Sean McKenzie sits down with Jason Barnhardt and Malcolm Eaton from Praxis Consulting, along with Jeff Barber from the Regina Public Library, to explore the enduring value of libraries in today's society, both in larger cities and smaller communities.

Both Jason and Malcolm were key players in a study SUMA recently hired Praxis Consulting to conduct into the provincial library system, and to make recommendations on what could be improved. Jeff has been the Library Director and CEO of the Regina Public Library since 2005 and has also worked within the Southeast regional library in Weyburn, been head of Access Services in the University of Saskatchewan, and is a past president of the Saskatchewan Library Association, as well as past Chair of the Canadian Urban Libraries Council.

From ebooks to streaming services, **technology has reshaped how we access information, yet libraries continue to offer something irreplaceable.** However, they are not without challenges. Funding remains an ongoing concern, and the demands on these institutions are increasing. What needs to change to ensure their future? This episode examines the essential services they provide, the unique structure of Saskatchewan's one-card system, and how regional collaboration ensures that resources remain available to as many people as possible. This discussion dives the pressing issues and possible solutions that could shape the next chapter of library services.

#### **Compost Facilities Update**

The <u>Compost Facilities Chapter</u> of the Saskatchewan Environmental Code has been approved and is in effect as of May 14.

What does this mean for you? If you're currently operating a compost facility in Saskatchewan, you have until October 1, 2025 to inform the ministry of your plans to continue your

operations. This includes both standalone facilities and those that are part of permitted landfills.

To make things easier for you, all you need to do is submit the required documents through our <u>online business portal</u>. You can find information about the notification process, including guidance documents, on our <u>compost facilities webpage</u>.

Existing landfill permits are not affected by the new chapter. However, when appropriate, we will be updating them to align with the chapter, removing any references to compost management. If you're planning to start a new facility or expand an existing one, please note you'll need to comply with the new chapter.

We believe this change will significantly boost the efficiency of composting operations across the province. It's designed to reduce the time municipalities spend on permitting and reporting, giving you more flexibility to achieve environmental compliance. Plus, composting is an important part of waste reduction – it keeps organic waste out of landfills and transforms it into nutrient-rich soil conditioner.

#### **Fire Underwriters Survey**

The Fire Underwriters Survey (FUS) is a national organization that assesses and rates the public fire protection capabilities of Canadian communities for the insurance industry. The ratings are published in the *Canadian Fire Insurance Grading Index*, used by around 85–90 % of Canada's private property & casualty insurers to determine fire protection grading, risk appetite, and premiums.

It has been brought to the attention of the Insurance Brokers Association of Saskatchewan that data contained in the index is out of date in many parts of Saskatchewan, negatively impacting the ability of local insurance brokers to secure appropriately priced insurance products for their clients.

#### Why It Matters to Municipalities

FUS ratings directly impact residential, commercial, and farm insurance pricing in Saskatchewan — it's vital that data be accurate. Inaccurate or out of date data can lead to artificially inflated (or deflated) premiums for the commensurate risk and, in some cases, is impacting insurers' willingness to extend coverage. Saskatchewan municipalities are encouraged to update via the online <u>FUS</u> <u>Municipal Portal</u>.

Once you find SUMA as a bill payee, you will need to set up two different accounts to pay as follows:

#### **SUMA's Group Benefits**

In early December 2024, your office would have received an email communication outlining the option to pay your group benefit premiums online. This message included your unique online account number required to facilitate these payments.

To pay group benefit premiums, the account number will be 8 digits starting with GB####### (e.g., GB123456).

If you do not have your account number, please contact the Group Benefits Department directly.

#### **General SUMA Invoices**

General SUMA invoices include all payments other than Group Benefits premiums, such as membership, VFF, Convention registration, education sessions registration, shipping labels, election and pet supplies, and more.

The account number to pay general SUMA invoices through online banking is found on the bottom right of invoices. It will be an 8-digit number starting with AR####### (e.g., AR123456).

#### **Preparing for Wildfire Threats**

The wildfire season in Saskatchewan is off to a devastating start, with many fires threatening SUMA's member municipalities in our northern regions.

There are three ways in which a wildfire can spread to a building:

1. Flying embers blown by wind can land and ignite the structure;

2. Fire can also spread from vegetation directly to the building walls; or

3. The heat generated from a wildfire can cause combustible building components to auto ignite (also known as "radiant heat effect").

Fuels, weather and topography work together to determine how fast or slow a fire will spread. If

your premises are located in the proximity of grasslands or wooded areas, you may be at risk.
