Advocacy Update

SUMA Joins FCM Annual Conference and Trade Show



Saskatchewan municipalities had a strong presence at the **Federation of Canadian Municipalities 2026 Annual Conference and Trade Show** in Edmonton from June 4 to 7, with 66 leaders from Saskatchewan in attendance. This included many from SUMA's governance team, including President Randy Goulden and Board Member Gerald Aalbers, who both serve on the FCM Board of Directors as well, along with SUMA Board Members Randy Donauer, Lyle Herman, and Michelle McKenzie along with SUMA CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau.

At the conference, SUMA had the opportunity to learn about numerous study tours that have been conducted, emphasizing innovation and the resolution of complex challenges, as well as climate commitments in action, regional connectivity, and economic growth at Canada's airports, among other topics. We were also able to attend workshops on topics including the importance of domestic food systems to our communities and Canada's future, as well as strategies for addressing homelessness in communities, among others. Like the study tours, these workshops provided us with experiential learning opportunities, with exercises designed and facilitated by individuals with lived experiences.

Advocacy is a key part of FCM's Annual Conference as participants are afforded the opportunity to attend addresses delivered by political leaders at the federal level. This year, speeches were delivered by Minister Dominic Leblanc, MP Scott Aitchison, Green Party Leader Elizabeth Green, and NDP Leader Avi Lewis, offering insights into the political perspectives of each respective party. Each speaker recognized the importance of the municipal sector and its role in providing essential services to Canadians. All four leaders discussed the necessity of infrastructure funding. Additionally, the ongoing tariff disputes with the United States were a topic of discussion, with all leaders acknowledging the impact these tariffs have on the municipal sector.

We also visited trade show, which featured over 200 suppliers offering services and products to municipalities nationwide.

Our continued partnership with FCM amplifies our local advocacy and ensures the Saskatchewan voice is part of national conversations on municipal governance.

Connecting with Municipal Administrators at the 2026 UMAAS Convention

In early June, we were pleased to join municipal administrators from across the province at the **2026 UMAAS Convention in Saskatoon**. CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau brought greetings on behalf of SUMA, sharing updates on our advocacy. Dependable and qualified administrators are essential to the ongoing healthy functioning of all municipalities, and we are committed to supporting municipal administrators through our partnership with UMAAS and our advocacy, events, educations, and programs.



Joining the Conversation on Municipal Energy with Energy for a Secure Future



On June 4, SUMA President Randy Goulden spoke at the **Municipal Energy Dialogue** session in Edmonton, hosted by **Energy for a Secure Future** in partnership with **Resource Works**. Discussions explored how communities are aligning energy decisions with economic and social priorities to build a more resilient future.

Saskatchewan's urban municipalities can both learn from other communities in the energy realm and provide valuable insights on behalf of our towns, villages, resort villages, cities, and northern municipalities.

Dialogue on Community Wellbeing and Regional Economic Development at Innovate Rural Conference

SUMA Board Member and Mayor of the City of Lloydminster Gerald Aalbers and SUMA Research Associate and Councillor with the City of Yorkton Stephanie Ortynsky recently joined a panel at the **Innovate Rural** conference in Estevan. The panel discussed how municipal leaders are integrating "wellbeing frameworks" into city planning, moving beyond traditional budgets to measure and fund quality of life to making social investments that can drive regional economic growth.

Bylaw Courts: Upcoming Media and Information Session

As part of the **Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods initiative**, the Provincial Court and the Government of Saskatchewan have been working together to support **municipal bylaw enforcement**.

Municipal bylaw court hubs are being expanded across the province. Two new bylaw court hubs have been implemented in Fort Qu'Appelle and Rosthern to better serve surrounding communities. Bylaw courts address violations of municipal bylaws, such as property standards, noise, animal control, and other community-level regulations. They provide a more accessible, community-focused way to resolve bylaw matters through Provincial Court.

The Government of Saskatchewan is hosting a **media event** on **today at 1 p.m. at the Lions Community Hall (2008 6th Ave, Rosthern, SK)**, with Justice Minister and Attorney General Tim McLeod, Chief Judge Shannon Metivier, Supervising Justice of the Peace Jennifer Fleming, and other government and community representatives. Anyone in your community involved in the writing, administration or prosecution of bylaw tickets is welcome to attend.

On **Thursday, June 18, from 10 a.m. to noon**, the Ministry of Justice and Attorney General will be hosting a **virtual information session** about the new bylaw court hubs. Our team of court officials will walk through the information package and answer any questions you may have.

Later today, an information package about the new municipal bylaw court hubs will be emailed to municipal offices, along with a calendar invite to the virtual session.

Henry's Law Introduced by the Province to Enhance Protection from Dangers of Carbon Monoxide

The Minister of Government Relations introduced *The Building Code (Henry's Law) Amendment Regulations, 2026* on May 5, 2026. This amendment to the National Building Code of Canada requires a carbon monoxide (CO) alarm in every residential suite or unit in a residential occupancy where a person sleeps in Saskatchewan. The enhanced regulations, known as Henry's Law, are named in honour of Henry Losco, who passed away from CO poisoning in Regina in December 2025.

Henry's Law will **require CO alarms in all multi-unit residential buildings** consisting of apartments, condominiums, houses with secondary suites and all other buildings with multiple residential suites by **November 1, 2026**, regardless of when the building was initially built or last renovated. This timeframe allows the ministry to offer education to building owners, local authorities, building officials and industry associations about their obligations under these amendments.

This program supports market-ready businesses looking to expand into tourism or enhance existing offerings. Funding of up to \$40,000 is available to help develop new experiences, extend seasonal

operations, or increase capacity. This is a great opportunity for businesses to create bookable experiences, such as tours, workshops, and more that can open new revenue streams. Cost-sharing is required, and applications are accepted until funds are fully committed. Why the Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Funding Grant Matters

Municipalities often face resource constraints, administrative hurdles, and governance complexities for starting new or costly initiatives beyond normal operations of the municipality. **Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Grant Funding** directly addresses these issues by reviewing applications to fund **75% of these costs** with the intent to:

- **Encourage Inter-Community Collaboration:** Projects must involve at least one partner municipality or community, fostering regional unity and shared solutions.
- **Enhance Governance and Capacity:** Funding supports training, restructuring, and strategic planning that elevates municipal leadership and administration.
- **Drive Innovation in Service Delivery:** From emergency management plans to regional land use strategies, TSS-funded projects improve efficiency and responsiveness.

Each project can receive up to **75% of eligible costs, capped at \$100,000 maximum funding**, making it a high-impact, low-barrier opportunity for municipalities to innovate and grow.

TSS is a portion of Municipal Revenue Sharing (\$1.5 million per fiscal year) used to encourage inter-community collaboration, help build capacity and promote good governance in all Saskatchewan municipalities. The funds are used to support projects that help municipalities strengthen their core governance and administration responsibilities

The TSS Steering Committee is now accepting applications for funding under this program. **Applications are accepted at any time of the year and will be reviewed on a monthly basis.**
