Nominations for SUMA President Close Today

Are you or someone you know interested in running for the position of SUMA President? Today is the final day to submit nominations for the election taking place on April 5. All elected officials from SUMA member municipalities in good standing are eligible to run for the position. Those interested in running are required to submit nomination papers signed by two other elected officials from any SUMA member municipality in good standing.

Nomination papers

All candidates who have filed their nomination papers are eligible to submit a one-page platform document (not exceeding 1,000 words) with photo that will be posted to the SUMA website and included in a one-time-only email to SUMA member municipalities. Platforms must also be submitted today.

All Residential Buildings to Have Carbon Monoxide and Smoke Alarms by July 1

As per Saskatchewan's Building Code Regulations, every building with residential occupancy is to have carbon monoxide and smoke alarms installed by **July 1**, regardless of when the building was constructed.

Residential occupancies are rented or owned buildings with sleeping quarters such as:

- houses
- duplexes
- apartments
- condominiums
- townhouses
- motels and hotels

Municipal Assessment Roll Must Be Prepared by May 1

Municipalities must have their assessment roll prepared no later than May 1. If a municipality is unable to meet the deadline, council must pass an Extension of Time Bylaw no later than May 31. The preparation of the assessment roll cannot be extended past July 30.

To mitigate the number of assessment appeals filed, administrators are being encouraged to explain to their property owners what their assessment means. Explain the difference between assessment and taxation. Post information on the municipal website or social media. Administrators can also direct property owners to the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency to view their property report.

Elected officials from SUMA member municipalities in good standing are eligible to vote in the election of SUMA's President. To vote, elected officials must either be registered to attend Convention in-person or online.

Sector meetings give delegates a chance to meet with colleagues from other municipalities in the same sector. This is a chance to discuss current issues affecting your sector. The sector meetings are on **April 5** at **8:15 a.m.**

SUMA AGM

COVID-19 UPDATE

Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine Approved for Children Aged 6 to 11

Health Canada has approved the use of Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine for children between the ages of six to 11.

The dosing schedule approved by Health Canada is to give two doses one month apart.

Weekly COVID-19 EPI Report

Each Thursday, the Ministry of Health releases a COVID-19 integrated epidemiology (EPI) report that includes laboratory-confirmed cases, deaths, tests, vaccination information, hospital and census trends, and distribution of rapid antigen tests.

For the week of March 6-12:

- 6,826 laboratory tests were performed in Saskatchewan reflecting 5.7 tests performed per 1,000 population.
- About one in nine laboratory tests were positive.
- The percentage of positive tests (11.8 per cent) was lower than in the previous week (12.7 per cent).
- 832 new cases were confirmed.
- There were 28 newly reported COVID-19 deaths compared to 13 in the previous week.
- There were 27.1 COVID-like illness patients per 1,000 emergency department visits which is lower than the average weekly rate in the previous six weeks (38.9 per week/1,000 visits).
- Ten (10) confirmed COVID-19 outbreaks in long-term care and care home settings were reported this week.
