## **SUMA Joins Saskatchewan Delegation** in Ottawa

SUMA was pleased to join a delegation from Saskatchewan in Ottawa on October 1st and 2nd, presenting a unified voice on Saskatchewan's unique needs to our Federal counterparts.

In addition to SUMA, the delegation included Government Relations Minister Eric Schmalz, Advanced Education Minister Ken Cheveldayoff; mayors of the cities of Regina, Saskatoon, Moose Jaw, Prince Albert, Swift Current, North Battleford, and Yorkton; and leadership from the Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities (SARM).

Over two days, we had the opportunity to meet with various Federal Ministers and staff, including Secretary of State Buckley Belanger, Minister of Housing and Infrastructure the Honourable Gregor Robertson, Minister for Prairies Economic Development Canada the Honourable Eleanor Olszewski, the Saskatchewan Conservative Caucus, Saskatchewan Senators, and satff from the offices of the Ministry of Finance and the Secretary of State for Small Business and Tourism.

The majority of our discussions centred around the need for federal investment in infrastructure, including a replacement for the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) fund.

We are calling on the Federal Government to introduce a permanent infrastructure program that increases the overall amount of funding available and ensures funding is long-term, sustainable, and predictable. This will allow communities to adequately plan for the future and use asset management practices that ensure the strong stewardship of public resources.



## Collaboration Between SUMA and the Provincial Association of Resort Communities of Saskatchewan



On October 16, SUMA President Randy Goulden and CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau met with the **Provincial Association of Resort Communities of Saskatchewan** (PARCS).

Resort villages are urban municipalities, and as such are SUMA members. While PARCS is an independent lobby organization and

continues to represent resort village and organized hamlet issues with all levels of government as well as with SUMA and SARM, our two organizations are closely aligned on meeting the needs of these communities, and we look forward to opportunities for collaboration between PARCS and SUMA to best serve Saskatchewan's resort communities.

#### Advancing Cooperation in Recreation

Earlier this month, SUMA CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau presented at Sparks 2025, hosted by the Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association and the Saskatchewan Association of Recreation Professionals.

CEO Nadeau discussed the importance of cooperation and working together and how to bring the recreation sector's voice to different policy tables.

The session was opened by Minister of Parks, Culture and Sport, the Honourable Alana Ross, who shared news that the Government of Saskatchewan will be **doubling the**Community Rink Affordability Grant. SUMA is pleased with this announcement, knowing that recreational facilities and services drive economic development and improve the life of residents of urban municipalities and surrounding regions.



## **Connecting with the Federation of Sri Lankan Local Government Authorities**

Earlier this month, a delegation from SUMA visited the Federation of Sri Lankan Local Government Authorities (FSLGA) as part of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' Partnerships for Municipal Innovation - Women in Local Leadership (PMI-WILL) project.



The visit centred around information sharing on SUMA's Board of Directors, including roles and responsibilities of Board members and a look into our caucus structure, member services provided by SUMA, and group work around member engagement, advocacy, and communications strategies.

SUMA has previously visited Benin, West Africa as part of the PMI-WILL Project, and we are grateful for continued opportunities to connect

with our sister federations across the globe to learn from one another.

#### Canada Post Services in Saskatchewan Communities

We are concerned with the Government of Canada's recent announcement of plans to transform Canada Post services.

In particular, we are opposed to the announced conversion of the door-to-door delivery services to community mailboxes. This will have negative impacts on our vulnerable populations including seniors, people with disabilities, and residents without vehicles. It would also shift new operational burdens to municipalities.



SUMA is advocating for the continuation of Canada Post as a public service, improved—rather than reduced—home and parcel delivery, the addition of postal banking, expanded electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure, and enhanced delivery to smaller communities and Indigenous communities.

Additionally, we urge the federal government to ensure a transparent public review and meaningful stakeholder engagement, including municipalities, before making any changes to the *Canada Post Corporation Act* or *Canadian Postal Service Charter*.

President and CEO of Canada Post Doug Ettinger has responded to the Government of Canada's in a letter to all Canadians. Read the letter in English or in French.





The Ministry of Highways is conducting a review of <u>The Vehicle Weight and Dimension</u> <u>Regulations, 2010</u> to ensure the regulations remain relevant. The review and the resulting changes are intended to:

- Explore the criteria used to update the list of highways that require route approval for oversized agricultural equipment;
- Assess the potential expansion of High Clearance Corridor routes;
- Explore the use of project permits;
- · Update the list of primary weight highways; and

## **Application Fee for Standalone HSWDG Facility Construction or Alterations**

Effective October 1, 2025, the Ministry of Environment has **implemented a \$1,000 application fee for the construction or alteration of stand-alone hazardous substance and waste dangerous goods (HSWDG) storage facilities**, as regulated under the Hazardous Substances and Waste Dangerous Goods Regulations.

This fee applies to applications submitted on or after October 1, 2025. This change supports cost-recovery and enhances the efficiency of regulatory processes.

The fee applies to:

- Approvals to construct new stand-alone HSWDG storage facilities that are not regulated through other permits or approvals by the ministry;
- Approvals to alter (expand) pre-existing stand-alone HSWDG storage that are not regulated through other permits or approvals by the ministry;
- Facilities such as, but not limited to, salvage yards, retail fuel stations, bulk fuel plants, agrichemical warehouses, waste dangerous goods collection sites and transfer stations.

## Regional Tariff Response Initiative for Saskatchewan, Alberta, and Manitoba

The Government of Canada will provide up to \$5 million in repayable funds or up to \$1 million in non-repayable funds to support businesses and sectors negatively impacted by tariffs from the U.S., China, and/or Canadian counter-tariffs.

The RTRI supports investments in growth and resiliency that will help businesses succeed and strengthen our economy and will prioritize project activities that:

- Have higher proportions of Canadian inputs
- Demonstrate greater economic benefits for the Prairies
- Support local, regional, or national supply chains

Eligible applicants include:

- Incorporated companies, corporations, and co-operatives
- Indigenous-owned businesses and organizations
- Non-profit organizations that support businesses

Applicants must show that at least 25% of their sales are in impacted markets or demonstrate they (or the businesses they support) have been directly affected by ongoing trade disruptions, including new U.S. and China tariffs or Canadian countermeasures.
