## 2026 CALL FOR RESOLUTIONS

deadline JANUARY 31, 2026

REAL District - Regina, Saskatchewan APRIL 12- 15

SUMA invites members to submit resolutions ahead of the 2026 SUMA Convention and Tradeshow in Regina, Saskatchewan, from April 12 to 15. Resolutions are an important way to bring forward issues confronting urban councils that require action by the provincial or federal government or another agency. Members are encouraged to submit resolutions on anything throughout the year. However, the deadline for receipt of council resolutions for Convention 2026 is January 31, 2026.

After concerns were raised by members about late resolutions and the inability for councils to discuss these resolutions in advance, only those late resolutions that are absolutely critical and could not possibly have been submitted early enough to be included in the Convention package will be brought forward, and only then with justification for why it is both urgent and emergent. Any other late resolutions will be considered by the SUMA caucuses after Convention.

Members are encouraged to review the <u>Resolutions Policy</u> before crafting their resolution.

#### Read the Full Call For Resolutions and Learn How to Submit

SUMA's move to a caucus model of governance has resulted in related changes to our resolutions process. While in previous years, we have had a resolutions committee review and recommend resolutions to our Board of Directors, this function will now be taken on by our sectoral caucuses. Members should still forward their resolutions to the SUMA office in Regina, but it will be our caucuses that review and make recommendations to the Board as to which resolutions should proceed to the Convention floor.

The number of proposed resolutions to be voted upon at Convention from each caucus has been limited to two. The caucuses may still choose to work independently on additional resolutions without full membership endorsement (i.e., resolutions that have not been brought forward and passed at Convention).

#### Submission of Resolutions

Members submit resolutions to SUMA. Resolutions can be submitted anytime, however, the deadline for consideration at Convention 2026 is January 31, 2026.



Each caucus reviews resolutions.

Each caucus chooses two (2) resolutions to recommend to the Board.



Board reviews resolutions recommended by each caucus.

Board provides resolutions package to members (March 2026).



SUMA members vote on resolutions at Convention 2026 (April 12-15).

While this represents a substantial change for our membership, it is meant to emphasize the intent of our Convention resolutions session: to bring additional media and government attention to those resolutions that will best benefit from that attention. Not every resolution requires this level of attention; many are better dealt with internally in discussions between SUMA elected officials or SUMA staff and their counterparts in the provincial and federal government. Members will still retain the ability to bring their concerns forward through resolutions, in addition to many opportunities provided through engaging with your caucus representatives, contacting SUMA staff, or attending our numerous events, including Convention.

Once resolutions have been recommended to the Board by each caucus, the Board will review and provide a package to all members in March 2026.

# Collaboration Between SUMA and the Provincial Association of Resort Communities of Saskatchewan



On October 16, SUMA President Randy Goulden and CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau met with the Provincial Association of Resort Communities of Saskatchewan (PARCS).

Resort villages are urban municipalities, and as such are SUMA members. While PARCS is an independent lobby organization and

continues to represent resort village and organized hamlet issues with all levels of government as well as with SUMA and SARM, our two organizations are closely aligned on meeting the needs of these communities, and we look forward to opportunities for collaboration between PARCS and SUMA to best serve Saskatchewan's resort communities.

#### Canada Post Services in Saskatchewan Communities

We are concerned with the Government of Canada's recent announcement of plans to transform Canada Post services.

In particular, we are opposed to the announced conversion of the door-to-door delivery services to community mailboxes. This will have negative impacts on our vulnerable populations including seniors, people with disabilities, and residents without vehicles. It would also shift new operational burdens to municipalities.



SUMA is advocating for the continuation of Canada Post as a public service, improved—rather than reduced—home and parcel delivery, the addition of postal banking, expanded electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure, and enhanced delivery to smaller communities and Indigenous communities.

Additionally, we urge the federal government to ensure a transparent public review and meaningful stakeholder engagement, including municipalities, before making any changes to the *Canada Post Corporation Act* or *Canadian Postal Service Charter*.

President and CEO of Canada Post Doug Ettinger has responded to the Government of Canada's in a letter to all Canadians. Read the letter in English or in French.







## **Nominations Closing Soon**

The TSS Steering Committee is now accepting applications for funding under this program.

Applications are accepted at any time of the year and will be reviewed on a monthly basis.

## **Opioid-Related Class Action Settlement Affecting Municipalities**

Napoli Shkolnik Canada wishes to notify SUMA's members of a recent class action settlement in the Court of King's Bench of Alberta affecting the rights of Canadian municipalities in relation to opioids.

Napoli Shkolnik Canada and Freeman Litigation are legal counsel to the City of Grand Prairie and the Corporation of the City of Brantford ("Representative Plaintiffs"). The Representative Plaintiffs have commenced a proposed class action proceeding on behalf of Canadian municipalities and local governments ("Class Members") that allege to have incurred abatement costs or other damages relating to opioid dependency and addiction in Canada. This proceeding has commenced against several pharmaceutical companies. The Representative Plaintiffs have reached a settlement agreement with one of the defendants, Mylan Pharmaceuticals ULC ("Mylan"). The Settlement Agreement was reached after considering several relevant factors, including Mylan's minimal sales of opioid products.

On October 14, 2025, the Court of King's Bench of Alberta issued an Order that requires notice of the settlement to be provided to potential Class Members.

SUMA is delivering the attached **Short Form Notice** on behalf of Napoli Shkolnik Canada to ensure any affected municipalities in Saskatchewan receive notice of the settlement.

## Consultation Opportunity: Review of The Vehicle Weight and Dimension

#### Regulations, 2010

The Ministry of Highways is conducting a review of <u>The Vehicle Weight and Dimension</u> <u>Regulations</u>, <u>2010</u> to ensure the regulations remain relevant. The review and the resulting changes are intended to:

- Explore the criteria used to update the list of highways that require route approval for oversized agricultural equipment;
- Assess the potential expansion of High Clearance Corridor routes;
- Explore the use of project permits;
- Update the list of primary weight highways; and
- Make housekeeping updates to ensure the regulations remain current and effective with industry standards.

As part of the review, the Ministry is seeking stakeholder input on the regulations, proposed amendments, and any suggested changes.

# Regional Tariff Response Initiative for Saskatchewan, Alberta, and Manitoba

The Government of Canada will provide up to \$5 million in repayable funds or up to \$1 million in non-repayable funds to support businesses and sectors negatively impacted by tariffs from the U.S., China, and/or Canadian counter-tariffs.

The RTRI supports investments in growth and resiliency that will help businesses succeed and strengthen our economy and will prioritize project activities that:

- Have higher proportions of Canadian inputs
- Demonstrate greater economic benefits for the Prairies
- Support local, regional, or national supply chains

Eligible applicants include:

- Incorporated companies, corporations, and co-operatives
- Indigenous-owned businesses and organizations
- Non-profit organizations that support businesses

Applicants must show that at least 25% of their sales are in impacted markets or demonstrate they (or the businesses they support) have been directly affected by ongoing trade disruptions, including new U.S. and China tariffs or Canadian countermeasures.
