## Federal Budget 2025 Recognizes Importance of Strengthening Communities, Further Plans for Local Infrastructure Still Needed

With the release of the 2025 Budget, SUMA supports the Government of Canada's commitment to building stronger communities, affirming the critical role of local infrastructure in driving Canada's economic development, trade, and housing. This recognition is a welcome step forward. The federal government now needs a robust and long-term investment strategy that meets the complex and urgent infrastructure needs facing municipalities.

Budget 2025 includes \$51 billion over the next ten years for the Build Communities Strong Fund. We are pleased to see commitments upheld through existing funding streams, including the Canada Community Building Fund and Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund (CHIF), continued through this infrastructure program. However, urban municipalities in Saskatchewan and across the country still face significant need. We need a plan and further dedicated investments to update and maintain local infrastructure so we can achieve the Government's 'big, bold' vision for our country's growth.

In building stronger communities, it is also critical that we ensure support for all residents, including the most vulnerable. We will look for continued funding streams to meet needs related to healthcare, mental health, addictions, and public safety.

We look forward to working alongside the federal government, provincial government, and other partners to determine what the next infrastructure program should look like, which we would like to see implemented in Budget 2026.

# 2026 CALL FOR RESOLUTIONS

deadline JANUARY 31, 2026

REAL District - Regina, Saskatchewan APRIL 12- 15

SUMA invites members to submit resolutions ahead of the 2026 SUMA Convention and Tradeshow in Regina, Saskatchewan, from April 12 to 15. Resolutions are an important way to bring forward issues confronting urban councils that require action by the provincial or federal government or another agency. Members are encouraged to submit resolutions on anything throughout the year. However, the deadline for receipt of council resolutions for Convention 2026 is January 31, 2026.

After concerns were raised by members about late resolutions and the inability for councils to discuss these resolutions in advance, only those late resolutions that are absolutely critical and could not possibly have been submitted early enough to be included in the Convention package will be brought forward, and only then with justification for why it is both urgent and emergent. Any other late resolutions will be considered by the SUMA caucuses after Convention.

Members are encouraged to review the <u>Resolutions Policy</u> before crafting their resolution.

### Read the Full Call For Resolutions and Learn How to Submit

SUMA's move to a caucus model of governance has resulted in related changes to our resolutions process. While in previous years, we have had a resolutions committee review and recommend resolutions to our Board of Directors, this function will now be taken on by our sectoral caucuses. Members should still forward their resolutions to the SUMA office in Regina, but it will be our caucuses that review and make recommendations to the Board as to which resolutions should proceed to the Convention floor.

The number of proposed resolutions to be voted upon at Convention from each caucus has been limited to two. The caucuses may still choose to work independently on additional resolutions without full membership endorsement (i.e., resolutions that have not been brought forward and passed at Convention).

#### Submission of Resolutions

Members submit resolutions to SUMA. Resolutions can be submitted anytime, however, the deadline for consideration at Convention 2026 is January 31, 2026.




Each caucus reviews resolutions.

SUMA members vote on resolutions at Convention 2026 (April 12-15).

While this represents a substantial change for our membership, it is meant to emphasize the intent of our Convention resolutions session: to bring additional media and government attention to those resolutions that will best benefit from that attention. Not every resolution requires this level of attention; many are better dealt with internally in discussions between SUMA elected officials or SUMA staff and their counterparts in the provincial and federal government. Members will still retain the ability to bring their concerns forward through resolutions, in addition to many opportunities provided through engaging with your caucus representatives, contacting SUMA staff, or attending our numerous events, including Convention.

Once resolutions have been recommended to the Board by each caucus, the Board will review and provide a package to all members in March 2026.





# Consultation Opportunity: Review of *The Vehicle Weight and Dimension Regulations*, 2010

The Ministry of Highways is conducting a review of <u>The Vehicle Weight and Dimension</u>

Regulations, 2010 to ensure the regulations remain relevant. The review and the resulting changes are intended to:

- Explore the criteria used to update the list of highways that require route approval for oversized agricultural equipment;
- Assess the potential expansion of High Clearance Corridor routes;
- Explore the use of project permits;
- · Update the list of primary weight highways; and
- Make housekeeping updates to ensure the regulations remain current and effective with

industry standards.

As part of the review, the Ministry is seeking stakeholder input on the regulations, proposed amendments, and any suggested changes.
