## **ADVOCACY UPDATE**

## **Building Partnerships**

From June 6-9 SUMA President Randy Goulden and CEO Jean-Marc Nadeau attended the annual Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) Convention in Calgary, Alberta. During the event, SUMA was recognized for our work to support municipalities through an Award of Excellence, International Programs.

**SUMA** also signed a green economy partnership agreement with Eco-West Canada, a subsidiary of the Association of Manitoba Bilingual Municipalities (AMBM). AMBM President Ivan Normandeau and SUMA President Randy Goulden were present for the signing. This formal agreement will **help SUMA create the Municipal Eco-Action Centre**, and help support our member municipalities on sustainable green infrastructure projects. # New Affordable Housing in Saskatoon

The Saskatchewan Government recently announced the construction of new affordable housing units in Saskatoon for low income individuals. The new, one-storey fourplex will be owned by the Saskatchewan Housing Corporation (SHC) and will provide affordable housing to four individuals renting through the Saskatoon Housing Authority. The federal government's National Housing Strategy (NHS) - Saskatchewan Priorities Initiative is providing \$1.1 million in funding for the project. Construction is expected to be complete in spring 2025.

SUMA is pleased to see this development as we've been advocating for affordable housing in our municipalities for some time. There is a critical need for it across the province as it directly impacts the homelessness and mental health and addictions crisis we are currently seeing.

A project such as this **takes cooperation and effort from all levels of government**. We hope to continue our work with both the federal and provincial governments to further increase the amount of affordable housing across Saskatchewan and alleviate the stress our communities feel.

## **Government Relations Proposes Opening Municipal Acts**

The Ministry of Government Relations is proposing to open the three municipal Acts for amendments in the 2025-26 legislative session. The legislation concerning municipal governance —The Cities Act, The Municipalities Act, and The Northern Municipalities Act, 2010 — is periodically reviewed and amended to respond to changing policy needs and stakeholder concerns. These three Acts will be reviewed concurrently for the greatest possible alignment and consistency; however, any suggested amendments are encouraged, whether they are common to all three or specific to one particular Act.

SUMA will have issues that we've collected and considered through our resolutions which we will bring forth. However, we encourage our members to take part in the process and respond to the review. On Wednesday June 19 at 10:00 a.m. join us for the webinar *Managing Waste: Funding and Stewardship*.

Presented by the Ministry of Environment speakers will provide information on the Impacted Sites Fund, waste stewardship and recycling programs, and solid waste management. Hear how the Impacted Site Fund provides financial support to municipal governments to clean up abandoned, environmentally impacted sites and what information your municipality needs to apply. Presenters will also discuss the progress that has been made since the Solid Waste Management Strategy was released in early 2020, how municipalities have been engaging with this strategy, and how they can continue to be an active participant in waste reduction.

Building on SUMA's latest webinar with Multi-Material Stewardship Western (MMSW), the conversation will continue regarding **Extended Producer Responsibility and how it affects municipalities.** The ministry will also provide information on management of inert waste, landfill construction, groundwater monitoring, transfer station code chapter, and compost facility requirements.

# **Municipal Administrator's Corner – Elections Resources**

2024 is a general election year for all municipalities in Saskatchewan. Cities, towns, villages, and northern municipalities will hold their general elections on November 13. Election day for resort villages is July 27. (Northern municipalities may move their election date earlier by decision of council).

To learn about amendments to <u>The Local Government Election Act, 2015</u> and <u>The Local Government Election Regulations, 2015</u>, please check out the document <u>Information</u> <u>Bulletin: Amendments to The Local Government Election Act, 2015</u>.

The Advisory Services and Municipal Relations branch has also updated several resources to assist election officials in carrying out their municipal election. The Election-Byelection Scheduling Tool is a great resource to map out the municipal election process and become familiar with the legislated dates and publishing requirements. The Local Government Election Guide for Saskatchewan municipalities has also been updated and is available to help municipal election officials understand the municipal election process and perform their duties.

## 2024 Municipal Election Information from SUMA

SUMA began offering election supplies and ballot printing during the 1997 election year. Members can take advantage of our bulk purchasing savings and friendly customer service when preparing for their municipal elections/byelections.

#### **Member Advantages**

- Substantial cost savings, based on bulk purchasing of supplies and bulk processing of ballots.
- Supplies shipped using the most cost effective method for each individual municipality (usually within 3-5 business days of order receipt).
- When the order is received by the SUMA office within 15 business days prior to the advance poll date, guaranteed processing of ballot orders to meet the limited turn-around time between close of nominations, advance poll, and election dates. Orders received less than 15 business days prior to the advance poll date cannot be guaranteed.
- Members will be invoiced directly from SUMA.

#### Submission of 2023 Financial Statements – Extension of Time

2023 financial statements are due to the Ministry of Government Relations by **July 1**. (**September 1** if a city).

If your municipality anticipates it will need more time to submit its 2023 financial statement, your council may pass an **extension of time bylaw for financial statements**.

#### That bylaw:

- Must be passed within 30 days after the time fixed according to provincially legislated deadline has expired no later than July 31 (October 1 if a city).
- It may extend the time specified by provincial legislation by no more than 90 days –
  no later than September 29 (November 30 if a city).

A certified copy of the bylaw, the reason for submitting a late financial statement, and the expected date the financial statement will be submitted to the ministry and should be emailed to <a href="mailto:financialstatements@gov.sk.ca">financialstatements@gov.sk.ca</a>. That email address can also be used to ask for more information.

The submission of financial statements to the ministry is required by provincial legislation and used as a **qualifying factor for funding**, including the Municipal Revenue Sharing and the Canada Community-Building Fund programs.

## Ditch is not the Dump: Let's Keep our Land Clean and Safe

To help raise public awareness, the Ministry of Environment launched an educational campaign to reduce the number of illegal dump sites in the province, focusing on northern areas that experience a disproportionate amount of illegal dumping.

This summer, encourage your community residents to:

- Dispose responsibly
- Use designated waste disposal sites and recycling facilities. See the province's list
  of <u>waste recycling programs</u> for the products your community will most likely start

- Burning plastic releases chemicals into the air we all breathe, causing long-term health problems.
- Spread the word
- Educate others about the impact of illegal dumping on our environment. Display

  your community.

## Clean Up Abandoned Impacted Sites through the Impacted Sites Fund

Is there an abandoned impacted site (such as a former gas station or laundromat) in your community? **Apply to the provincial government's <u>Impacted Sites Fund</u>** for funding towards assessment and clean up!

The Impacted Sites Fund is designed to address contaminated areas that have been left abandoned and pose a risk to the environment. The fund is available to municipalities to assess and remediate impacted sites acquired through tax arrears.

With this funding, you can contribute to a cleaner environment, enhance public safety and create economic and social development opportunities in your community. Read about the <u>Town of Shaunavon</u> – the first successful applicant for funding. In the summer of 2023, the town received an additional \$35,174 to fully characterize the impacts at the site.
