SUMA Hosts Discussion with Minister of Finance and National Revenue on Federal Budget 2025

On November 20, SUMA hosted the Honourable François-Philippe Champagne, Minister of Finance and National Revenue, for an insightful conversation on the 2025 Federal Budget. SUMA President Randy Goulden moderated the discussion, which focused on support for infrastructure, agricultural producers and processors, natural resource and energy industries, trade and export, public safety, mental health, addictions, and housing.

"Saskatchewan's urban municipalities play a critical role in driving Canada's economic development, providing necessary infrastructure and services to fuel industry and strengthen our communities," said President Goulden. "We were proud to host Minister Champagne in our provincial capital and look forward to working together to ensure the Saskatchewan perspective remains central as the Government of Canada implements its budget."

The event was attended by the Government of Saskatchewan's Minister of Government Relations, city mayors, and leaders in the municipal sector, business, real estate, infrastructure development, agriculture, and education.

The event took place at the Regina Globe Theatre with support from the Regina Downtown Business Improvement District.

Last week SUMA hosted representatives from the Ministry of Government Relations, including Minister Eric Schmalz, and the Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities (SARM) for the Municipal Forum.

These discussions are an important part of moving the priorities of Saskatchewan's municipalities, both rural and urban, forward.



SUMA City Mayors Caucus Meets in Regina

The SUMA City Mayors Caucus met in Regina on November 19-20, beginning with an MLA reception on the evening of the 19th that hosted various MLAs from both the Government and the Opposition, along with the SUMA Board of Directors and mayors and city managers from most of Saskatchewan's 16 cities. On the 20th, the CMC began its meeting by attending our event with the Federal Minister of Finance and National Revenue, François-Philippe Champagne, and then worked through an agenda that included updates from SUMA's pre-budget advocacy work, our mental health and addictions working group and our legal and legislative working group, and reports on the recent federal budget, SUMA's member survey, and the potential expansion of ridesharing throughout the province.

Visits with the Town of Rosthern, MP Scott Aitchison

SUMA's President and CEO recently had the opportunity to visit the **Town of Rosthern** with **MP Scott Aitchison**.

Rosthern Mayor Dennis Helmuth hosted us on a tour where we visited the site of the planned water treatment plant and the recently opened multi-service medical clinic.

We also met with the **Twin Rivers Economic Development** group, a group of seven urban and rural municipalities that are working to enhance the region's approach to economic development.



Finally, we had a number of important discussions around priority issues for Saskatchewan's urban municipalities with MP Aitchison.

Thank you, MP Aitchison, for your time, and Mayor Helmuth, for your hospitality.

Updates from November Caucus Meetings

Each of SUMA's Caucuses held meetings in November.

At each meeting, Caucus members had a focus group with SUMA's Events and Education team to provide feedback on last year's **Convention and Tradeshow** and input on the 2026 theme and messaging, ideas for keynote and education sessions, suggestions for tradeshow and networking improvements, and other creative ways to enhance the member experience that will support future planning. The agenda also highlighted SUMA's **2026-27 federal and provincial pre-budget asks** and correspondence between SUMA and various Ministers. Further details about each Caucus meeting are below.

Northern Caucus

As this was the first meeting of the Northern Caucus, the focus of the meeting was establishing the main advocacy priorities for the coming year. Policing, housing, healthcare, infrastructure, mental health and addictions, jurisdictional issues, and the need for a proper firefighting strategy were identified, with particular attention noted to the unique needs of SUMA's northern members in these areas. SUMA's advocacy staff will take these priorities forward and begin work on each. Terms of Reference were also approved with minor edits, and La Ronge Councillor Abby Besharah was elected Northern Caucus Vice Chair.

2026 CALL FOR RESOLUTIONS

deadline JANUARY 31, 2026

REAL District - Regina, Saskatchewan APRIL 12- 15

SUMA invites members to submit resolutions ahead of the 2026 SUMA Convention and Tradeshow in Regina, Saskatchewan, from April 12 to 15. Resolutions are an important way to bring forward issues confronting urban councils that require action by the provincial or federal government or another agency. Members are encouraged to submit resolutions on anything throughout the year. However, the deadline for receipt of council resolutions for Convention 2026 is January 31, 2026.

After concerns were raised by members about late resolutions and the inability for councils to discuss these resolutions in advance, only those late resolutions that are absolutely critical and could not possibly have been submitted early enough to be included in the Convention package will be brought forward, and only then with justification for why it is both urgent and emergent. Any other late resolutions will be considered by the SUMA caucuses after Convention.

Members are encouraged to review the <u>Resolutions Policy</u> before crafting their resolution.

Read the Full Call For Resolutions and Learn How to Submit

SUMA's move to a caucus model of governance has resulted in related changes to our resolutions process. While in previous years, we have had a resolutions committee review and recommend resolutions to our Board of Directors, this function will now be taken on by our sectoral caucuses. Members should still forward their resolutions to the SUMA office in Regina, but it will be our caucuses that review and make recommendations to the Board as to which resolutions should proceed to the Convention floor.

The number of proposed resolutions to be voted upon at Convention from each caucus has been limited to two. The caucuses may still choose to work independently on additional resolutions without full membership endorsement (i.e., resolutions that have not been brought forward and passed at Convention).

Submission of Resolutions

Members submit resolutions to SUMA. Resolutions can be submitted anytime, however, the deadline for consideration at Convention 2026 is January 31, 2026.

Review of Resolutions by Caucuses

Each caucus reviews resolutions.

Each caucus chooses two (2) resolutions to recommend to the Board.

Recommendation of Resolutions to Board

Board reviews resolutions recommended by each caucus.

Board provides resolutions package to members (March 2026).

Endorsement of Resolutions

SUMA members vote on resolutions at Convention 2026 (April 12-15).

While this represents a substantial change for our membership, it is meant to emphasize the intent of our Convention resolutions session: to bring additional media and government attention to those resolutions that will best benefit from that attention. Not every resolution requires this level of attention; many are better dealt with internally in discussions between SUMA elected officials or SUMA staff and their counterparts in the provincial and federal government. Members will still retain the ability to bring their concerns forward through resolutions, in addition to many opportunities provided through engaging with your caucus representatives, contacting SUMA staff, or attending our numerous events, including Convention.

Once resolutions have been recommended to the Board by each caucus, the Board will review and provide a package to all members in March 2026.



Why the Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Funding Grant Matters

Municipalities often face resource constraints, administrative hurdles, and governance complexities for starting new or costly initiatives beyond normal operations of the municipality. **Targeted Sector Support (TSS) Grant Funding** directly addresses these issues by reviewing applications to fund **75% of these costs** with the intent to:

- Encourage Inter-Community Collaboration: Projects must involve at least one partner municipality or community, fostering regional unity and shared solutions.
- Enhance Governance and Capacity: Funding supports training, restructuring, and strategic planning that elevate municipal leadership and administration.
- **Drive Innovation in Service Delivery:** From emergency management plans to regional land use strategies, TSS-funded projects improve efficiency and responsiveness.

Each project can receive up to **75% of eligible costs, capped at \$100,000 maximum funding,** making it a high-impact, low-barrier opportunity for municipalities to innovate and grow.

TSS is a portion of Municipal Revenue Sharing (\$1.5 million per fiscal year) used to encourage inter-community collaboration, help build capacity and promote good governance in all Saskatchewan municipalities. The funds are used to support projects that help municipalities strengthen their core governance and administration responsibilities

The TSS Steering Committee is now accepting applications for funding under this program.

Applications are accepted at any time of the year and will be reviewed on a monthly basis.

Weed and Pest Control: Updates from Ministry of Agriculture

The Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture has two reminders for urban municipalities.

- 1. Annual appointments for Weed Inspectors and Pest Control Officers are to be sent to the Ministry of Agriculture at the beginning of each calendar year. Please send the appointment letter to the Ministry by email to crops@gov.sk.ca and include:
 - The appointed official's name
 - The appointed official's contact address, including phone number and email if available.

Appointments expire December 31 each year, so please set a reminder to send in appointment letters in January each year.

- 2. Annual weed and pest reports are due to the Ministry of Agriculture (crops@gov.sk.ca) by December 31 every year.
 - Appointed weed inspectors are to prepare and deliver an annual weed report using a
 provided template along with copies of any agreements made and orders issued, to the
 municipal administrator. A copy is then forwarded to the Ministry of Agriculture.
 - Municipalities are to prepare and submit an annual pest report using a provided template.
 This report should include details of pest or nuisance pest reports and notifications, agreements made and orders issues, fines issued and summaries of any appeals. You may also include relevant reports from your appointed pest control officer.
 - You can access the annual report template for the weed report here- Weed Inspectors in Saskatchewan and for the pest report here- The Plant Health Act and The Plant Health Regulations

Solid Waste Management Strategy: Invitation to Provide Feedback

In 2020, the **Ministry of Environment** released the **Solid Waste Management Strategy** to address the ongoing challenges in waste management, identify potential new economic opportunities for industry, and outline the government's commitments for action. The strategy sets goals and priorities, establishing the government's direction and commitment to solid waste management.

The strategy is now up for its five-year renewal. A renewed strategy will build on our achievements and identify new opportunities to enhance waste management in Saskatchewan.
