Canada Public Transit Fund Report

On July 25 the Government of Canada released a report on the feedback received through national public engagement sessions on Canada's first permanent public transit fund. Starting in 2026-27, and worth \$3 billion annually, the fund is titled Permanent, Integrated, and Locally Responsive: New Foundations for Public Transit Funding in Canada.



Over the next months, the Government will work closely with its transit partners to refine program design and strengthen our collective ability to deliver high-quality and accessible public transit and active transportation for Canadians. 

The Ministry of Health has issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) to find an organization to develop and operate a provincial suicide postvention program. Postvention refers to the actions taken to address the immediate psychological needs of family members and friends of people who have died by suicide or survived with significant injury or trauma.



The Ministry of Health is providing \$200,000 in annualized funding toward the development of the provincial suicide postvention program. This is part of the \$518 million for mental health and addiction services provided in 2023-24. You can learn more about the RFP here.

Waterworks Financial Overviews Due September 1

Municipalities that must submit a 2022 waterworks financial overview to the Ministry of Government Relations are required to do so by September 1, 2023.

This waterworks data is collected for assessing sustainability and improving transparency. Failure to submit the information may affect eligibility to access funding under the Municipal Revenue Sharing program.

ADVOCACY UPDATES

Mental Health and Addictions Advocacy

SUMA's advocacy on mental health and addiction issues across the province pushed the Saskatchewan Government to take progressive steps toward a large and complicated crisis. In a media release this month, the province committed to allocating six detox beds to residents in Yorkton and surrounding areas. You can read the media release here.



This decision is only one piece of the puzzle, but we are glad to see the province acknowledging the crisis, especially on the heels of some of our communications and advocacy work. As you know, Vice-President Gerald Aalbers released a video, urging the province to make changes to SIS. A few months later, we met with Ministers Paul Merriman and Everett Hindley to further discuss issues around mental health and addictions, and highlighted our advocacy on social media. Following these discussions, local media outlets across the province spotlighted various problems connected with mental health and addictions plaguing our hometowns. All of these strategies culminated in pushing the province to make some changes.

While there is more work to do, **SUMA** is encouraged by this progress and will continue to push for greater change.
