New Funding Announced to Support Local and Indigenous Community-Based Rail Safety Engagement



Transport Canada has announced a new rail safety component under the Community Participation Funding Program and launched a call for proposals for 2021-22 with up to **\$300,000 in funding available**.

The objectives of the Community Participation Funding Program - Rail Safety Component include: supporting the participation of, and collaboration with, local and Indigenous communities and organizations in Transport Canada's engagement processes; and

• increasing awareness and improving information sharing regarding risks and mitigations associated with railway safety.

The Community Participation Funding Program - Rail Safety Component aims to provide short-term grants with the goal of supporting the participation of eligible communities and organizations in the development and improvement of Canada's rail safety transportation system. Recipients will be encouraged to share their knowledge and expertise of local environments to help inform rail safety initiatives and future programming.

FCM Program Stream Focused on Local Solutions to Achieve Net Zero at GLOBE Forum 2022

The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) is partnering with GLOBE Forum 2022 to deliver a **municipal-focused program stream on achieving net zero**.

In this first-of-its-kind partnership for FCM and GLOBE, sustainability leaders from cities and communities across Canada will join leading change-makers to outline a vision for local pathways to net-zero emissions from buildings, energy, transportation, and waste.

FCM's Local Solutions to Net Zero track will focus on high-impact areas where municipalities have an essential role to play: buildings, energy, transportation, and waste. Within these topics, this stream will showcase local innovation that can be accelerated and scaled up, as well as explore implementation challenges related to procurement, governance, and regulation—all of which require new partnerships with the private sector and unprecedented cooperation between orders of government. Participants will have the opportunity to meet and interact with municipal practitioners and elected officials, technology providers, and leading thinkers on community sustainability on-site at the Vancouver Convention Centre and via virtual livestream. FCM's municipal stream presents a set of tangible local pathways that will enable Canada, and the world, to achieve a net-zero emissions future

Don't Forget to Put the Municipal Revenue Sharing Declaration of Eligibility on Your Council Meeting Agenda

In November, the Ministry of Government Relations emailed municipalities their unique link and password to access the online Municipal Revenue Sharing Declaration of Eligibility Form.

Municipalities are required to report their compliance with eligibility requirements to receive their Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant. The deadline to submit the Declaration of Eligibility is **January 31**. A resolution from council is required, so municipalities are encouraged to include the Declaration of Eligibility on their council

The Ministry of Environment released the <u>Solid Waste Management Strategy</u> in 2020 with a goal of modernizing regulations which includes a commitment to develop a Transfer Station chapter for inclusion in the Saskatchewan Environmental Code. The ministry is now seeking feedback on the proposed new Transfer Station chapter.

The Transfer Station chapter will establish an efficient application system for Saskatchewan that will minimize the time applicants spend applying and reapplying for permits and submitting reports. meeting agenda before January 31.

The Government of Saskatchewan has introduced a new policing initiative to target gang-related criminal activity entering the province through trafficking corridors. The



Farmland Drainage and Environmental Virtual Conference December 14-17

The Citizens Environmental Alliance (CEA) is holding its third annual Farmland Drainage and Environmental Virtual Conference from **December 14-17**.

Saskatchewan Trafficking Response Team (STRT) is a specialized intelligence-led enforcement team dedicated to addressing illegal weapons, drugs, and human trafficking.

The STRT will be comprised of 30 RCMP officers, six municipal police officers, two criminal analysts, and three support staff, for a total of 41 new permanent positions. STRT will have three offices strategically located in Lloydminster, Estevan, and Swift Current.

WCB Raising Average Premium Rate for 2022

The Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) has approved the 2022 average employer premium rate of \$1.23 per hundred dollars of payroll. This is the first increase to the average premium rate since 2004. The 2021 rate was \$1.17.

SUMA's Advocacy on Changing the Municipal Election Date

Earlier this year, Saskatchewan's Chief Electoral Officer suggested the municipal election date be changed to avoid voter confusion.

Through a SUMA survey, polls at regional meetings, and a discussion at the City Mayors' Caucus, SUMA asked what date members would prefer for municipal elections. Based on your feedback, SUMA will be advocating for a **May election date for cities** and a **September 2024 election date for towns, villages, resort villages, and northern municipalities.**

Mandatory Vaccinations and Masking at Convention 2022

On December 3, SUMA's Board of Directors met for a Board of Directors Meeting, and the agenda included discussions on SUMA's 2022 Convention and Tradeshow.

Earlier this year, the Board of Directors made the decision to have an in-person event. However, at the time of decision, the number of COVID-19 cases in the province was declining and the Government of Saskatchewan was removing restrictions.

During the recent Board of Directors Meeting, the Board discussed whether to move forward with in-person or pivot to a virtual event. Based on member feedback - in a recent *Municipal Update* poll, 79 per cent of respondents said they would attend in person - the recent success of Agribition, and in consultation with SUMA's sister associations, the Board of Directors made the decision to continue **moving forward with in-person.** The Board of Directors does not want to miss this opportunity to come together in-person and connect. However, if public health measures restrict gatherings, the plans will change. Delegate safety is a top priority.

With safety in mind, the SUMA Board of Directors has decided to introduce a number of measures at the 2022 Convention in April to reduce the transmission of COVID-19. This includes **mandatory masking** and **proof of vaccinations**; a negative COVID-19 test will not be accepted. These measures will be in place even if the provincial health orders requiring mandatory masking and vaccinations have expired or been rescinded. The goal with all of the precautions SUMA will be taking is to make Convention a zero-spread event. Watch your email for more information.

The SK Vax Wallet app has been updated to display the full vaccination certificate with both the Government of Saskatchewan and Government of Canada's visual identity wordmarks to support international travel.
