### Municipal Revenue Sharing - Declaration of Eligibility

The Ministry of Government Relations has emailed municipalities their unique link and password for the online Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) Grant Declaration of Eligibility. If you did not receive the email and it is not in your SPAM/JUNK folder, email the ministry at <a href="mailto:grcompliance@gov.sk.ca">grcompliance@gov.sk.ca</a> requesting the email be re-sent.

To avoid having your municipality's Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant for 2021-22 withheld, ensure your municipality submits its Declaration of Eligibility to the ministry and that your municipality meets all eligibility requirements. The deadline for submission of the online Declaration of Eligibility is January 31, 2021.

A completed declaration requires a resolution from council confirming the eligibility requirements the municipality meets. Therefore, administrators will want to include the Declaration of Eligibility on the November, December, or January council meeting agenda.

Donna Harpauer, who will retain her role as Minister of Finance, was named Deputy Premier.
