Community Rink Affordability Grant Returns

The Government of Saskatchewan has reinstated the Community Rink Affordability Grant, with registration officially opening today, **December 14**.

The program provides funding for community-owned indoor skating rinks and curling rinks. A maximum of

\$2,500 will be available per ice surface to help offset the expenses in eligible indoor skating and curling rinks for the 2020-21 operating season. The grant may be used to offset the cost of rink operations, minor capital upgrades, or to outfit the facility with COVID-19 safety-related expenditures.

Municipalities of Saskatchewan has been advocating for the reinstatement of the grant since it was cut in 2017. We're pleased to see the grant return to help cover the costs of operating rinks in Saskatchewan's hometowns.

Traffic Safety Fund Grant

Applications for the Provincial Traffic Safety Fund Grant program are being accepted starting **January 1**.

Individuals representing municipalities and Indigenous lands/territories can apply for this grant to undertake traffic safety initiatives in their communities. Grants of up to \$100,000 per location are available. Learn more.

New PSE Locations

Is speeding an issue in your community? Apply to bring photo speed enforcement (PSE) technology to your community. New PSE technology locations will be recommended by the PSE Committee. Locations that may be eligible include high-risk, high-collision, and high-volume pedestrian areas. More information is available on SGI's website at www.sgi.sk.ca/photo-speed-enforcement.

The application deadline for both programs is **March 31**. All applications will be assessed by the PSE Committee, with decisions for the Traffic Safety Fund reached by June 30. The camera grant is reviewed and forwarded to Government of Saskatchewan for final decision.

Board of Revision Training for 2021 Revaluation

New online training is available to support municipal boards of revision for the 2021 property revaluation.

The online training, a mixture of prerecorded and live-sessions, will cover topics including:

- Principles of administrative justice.
- Effective hearings/administrative tribunal proceedings.
- Rules of evidence for administrative tribunals.
- Plain language in administrative tribunal proceedings and decisions.
- Post-administrative tribunal hearing deliberation and decision writing.

MRS Declaration of Eligibility

To receive Municipal Revenue Sharing for 2021-22, municipalities are required to submit a Declaration of Eligibility to the ministry and ensure their municipality meets all eligibility requirements.

The Ministry of Government Relations has emailed municipalities their unique link and password for the online Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) Grant Declaration of Eligibility. The deadline for submission of the online Declaration of Eligibility is **January 31.**

If your municipality did not receive the email and it is not in your spam/junk folder, email the ministry at grcompliance@gov.sk.ca.

A completed declaration requires a resolution from council confirming the eligibility requirements the municipality meets.

FCM Vision for Green, Inclusive Economic Recovery

The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) has released silage, but at the end of its useful life, plastic twine is challenging to manage. Disposal in a landfill can result in the twine twisting around the wheels of landfill equipment and disposal by burning or burying is detrimental to the environment.

Cleanfarms has launched a pilot program in Saskatchewan to collect baler twine for recycling. The pilot will involve 30 collection locations.
