Municipal Revenues

Municipal Responsibilities

- Scrape the Marshals Service and hire more local police officers
- Invest in mental health and addictions services
- Go after organized crime and drug traffickers with an Unexplained Wealth Taskforce
- Protect families, small businesses and places of worship with an \$2.0 million rebate program for security updates like alarms, doorbell cameras and motion sensor lights

Provincial Downloading

- Introduce a Landlord and Tenant Rent Protection Act which will protect tenants from excessive and unreasonable rent increases and protect landlords by bringing back the option for direct payment for social service clients that miss a payment, in order to reduce late or missed rental payments. The Act will be built with tenants, landlords and housing organizations to ensure predictability in the rental market.
- Make all vacant provincial housing units available for families within four years by reversing the Sask. Party's \$40 million cut to the renovation budget, with 500 units targeted to be ready for occupancy in the first year.

Municipal Responsibilities

- Funding more police officer positions, adding addictions treatment spaces and strengthening *The Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods (SCAN) Act* and other related legislation to better address issues like public intoxication, vandalism, loitering and nuisance properties.
- Amendments to *The Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act* will provide officers with additional authority to address public nuisances and shut down nuisance properties, address intoxication on public property, vandalism, and individuals behaving in a disruptive manner on public property or in public spaces.

Provincial Downloading

- Increase the Disability Tax Credit, the Caregiver Tax Credit and the income exemption limit under the Saskatchewan Assured Income for Disability (SAID) program. The Saskatchewan Party will increase the amount an individual, couple or family can earn without reducing their SAID benefit by \$1,000.
