# Meeting with Minister of Government Relations

On January 10, SUMA President Randy Goulden met with newly appointed Minister of **Government Relations**, the Honourable Eric Schmalz.

Our partnership with Government Relations is a key aspect of the work we do with the provincial government and we look forward to many more meetings with Minister Schmalz and the rest of the Cabinet to advance the interests of Saskatchewan's urban municipalities.

### **Meeting with SARM**

On January 7, SUMA President, Randy Goulden, and CEO, Jean-Marc
Nadeau met with SARM's Acting President Bill Huber and Executive Director Laurel Feltin. They
discussed various topics affecting both organizations, including public safety, the Municipal Eco-



**Action Centre**, and the potential of **tariffs being imposed by the U.S. government**, something that would impact industries in urban and rural municipalities throughout the province.

SUMA looks forward to continuing to work with SARM to address issues important to urban and rural municipalities across Saskatchewan.

# FCM's Call for nominations: Vacancy for Saskatchewan representative on the Board of Directors

There are three vacant seats in FCM's Prairies and Territories Caucus. These roles must be filled by Saskatchewan representatives, who will serve until the end of the current board term in June 2025. The positions are as follows:

- at least one seat for three largest (by population) Municipal Members.
- one or two at-large seats, depending on the number of seats filled by the largest cities.

Eligible elected municipal representatives are invited to run for these Board positions. In accordance with FCM's bylaws, those who are eligible to serve as directors on FCM's Board must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be an elected official of an FCM member municipality from Saskatchewan.
- 2. Complete and submit the Consent and Board Profile Form.
- 3. Submit an official resolution <u>(see this example)</u> endorsed by their member municipality authorizing them to seek a position on FCM's Board of Directors and agreeing to cover the costs of their attendance at meetings.

### **Funding from Housing, Infrastructure and Communities Canada**

The Minister of Housing, Infrastructure and Communities Canada, Sean Fraser, announced the launch of new capital project intakes under the Active Transportation Fund and the Rural Transit Solutions Fund.

#### **Active Transportation Fund**

The Active Transportation Fund supports the **development and enhancement of active transportation networks** to provide Canadians with the opportunity to safely and affordably reach destinations by active modes of transportation. A minimum of 10% of the Active Transportation Fund's funding will be allocated to projects that benefit Indigenous populations and communities.

Applications are currently being accepted through Housing, Infrastructure and Communities Canada's <u>Applicant Portal</u> until <u>February 26</u> (7:00 p.m. EST). Applicants are encouraged to review information provided on the <u>Active Transportation Fund website</u>, <u>Applicant Guide</u> and <u>Step-by-Step Guide</u> prior to creating an application. #### **Rural Transit Solutions Fund**

The Rural Transit Solutions Fund supports the development and expansion of locally driven transit solutions, by helping residents of rural, remote, Indigenous and Northern communities conduct their day-to-day activities, like accessing services, going to work, school, medical appointments, and visiting loved ones. A minimum of 10% of the Rural Transit Solutions Fund's funding will be allocated to projects that benefit Indigenous populations and communities

Applications for the Capital Projects stream are now being accepted through the Housing, Infrastructure and Communities Canada's <u>Applicant Portal</u>. Applications will be accepted from all applicants until <u>March 4</u> (3:00 p.m. EST). Before applying, applicants are encouraged to review the information in the <u>Capital Projects stream Application Guide</u> and follow the <u>Capital Projects stream Step-by-Step Guide</u>. # Micro-credential Course: Municipal Leadership in Addressing Substance Use Harms

SUMA is pleased to announce University of Saskatchewan's new micro-credential course, from the School of Public Health, called *Municipal Leadership in Addressing Substance Use Harms*. This is a 40 hour, 8-week asynchronous online course. It is equivalent to 1 university credit unit. The class will be taught by **Dr. Barbara Fornssler**, an Assistant Professor at the School of Public Health, University of Saskatchewan, and by **Jennifer Chouinard**, **BA BSW MPP**, a PhD Candidate at the Johnson Shoyama Graduate School of Public Policy, University of Regina.

The course addresses the following four topics:

- 1. The Substance Use and Addictions Continuum: The Role of Stigma in Health
- 2. Substance Use Interventions: Harm Reduction and Prevention; Health and Wellness

Promotion; Treatment and Recovery

- 3. Evidence and Strategic Intervention: Municipal Leadership
- 4. Public Policy, Engagement, and Advocacy

This is a **policy-focused course**, ideal for professionals looking to:

- Refine their skills in articulating the complexities of substance use and stigma.
- Apply evidence-based strategies for reducing substance use harms including prevention, treatment and recovery services.
- Develop and evaluate policies in partnership with a range of health system and community stakeholders.
- Communicate effectively with the public to align health initiatives with local support services.

Course tuition is \$750 plus taxes and fees and participants receive a certificate and digital badge upon completion. If cost is a barrier to enrollment, please <a href="mailto:emailt

### SK Recycles: New Household and Paper Recycling Program

SK Recycles, in partnership with SARCAN, launched its new household packaging and paper recycling program in Saskatchewan, expanding recycling opportunities for residents. As part of the SK Recycles program, all <u>73 SARCAN Recycling depots</u> will collect flexible plastics, foam packaging, and non-deposit glass bottles and jars, providing free and accessible options for residents to recycle these materials. This partnership moves the collection of these materials from Phase 3 to Phase 1 of the transition and reflects efforts toward achieving efficient and sustainable packaging and paper recycling as the province transitions towards a full extended producer responsibility (EPR) model.

Newly accepted materials include:

- 1. **Flexible Plastics** (plastic bags; stand-up and zipper lock pouches; crinkly wrappers and bags; plastic net bags; plastic protective packaging).
- 2. **Foam Packaging** (foam take-out containers; foam trays for meat, seafood, or vegetables; foam protective packaging for electronics or appliances).
- 3. Glass Bottles and Jars (bottles and jars for olive oil, pickles, jam, etc.).

Glass will be recycled in Saskatchewan and Alberta, where it will be made into reflective glass beads for road marking paint and fibreglass insulation. Both flexible plastics and foam packaging will be recycled in British Columbia, where flexible plastics will be made into plastic pellets for manufacturing of new plastic products such as bins and buckets, and foam will be prepared to be made into picture frames and crown moulding.

# **Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund (CHIF)**

Housing, Infrastructure and Communities Canada launched its application intake for the \$1 billion direct delivery stream of the Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund (CHIF).

They are now accepting proposals from eligible applicants, such as municipalities and Indigenous communities, for projects with total eligible costs ranging between \$1 million and \$100 million, under a continuous intake stream until March 31 at 3:00 pm ET.

Projects may be pulled for assessment at various times during the intake period, with projects being recommended for approval prior to the intake closing on **March 31** and on May 19 at 3:00 p.m. ET for Indigenous applicants.

In order to support Indigenous-led projects, at least 10 per cent of the funding envelope will be dedicated to eligible Indigenous recipients.

### **Municipal Revenue Sharing Declaration of Eligibility**

Municipalities are required to annually report their compliance with eligibility requirements to receive their Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) grant by completing an online Declaration of Eligibility (declaration). The unique link and password for the online declaration was emailed to each municipality on **November 15**. If you have not received it, please email grcompliance@gov.sk.ca.

The deadline for submission of the declaration is **January 31**. Please ensure your municipality's declaration is submitted by the deadline, even if the municipality does not meet all eligibility requirements.

### **Applications for the Community Rink Affordability Grant Now Open**

Applications for the **2024-25 Community Rink Affordability Grant opened on January 6**. Communities, First Nations, schools and non-profits are eligible and encouraged to register for the annual grant of **\$2,500 per indoor ice surface**. The grant helps offset the costs of operating indoor skating and curling rinks in Saskatchewan.

The Saskatchewan government will double the program funding to \$3.2 million starting in 2025-26, increasing the grant to \$5,000 per rink.

The application period closes February 28 with the grant set to be paid out in March.
