**Municipalities of Saskatchewan Calling for Municipal Support  
from Provincial Parties**

Today Municipalities of Saskatchewan reviewed the available election platforms issued by the registered political parties participating in the 2020 provincial election and was disappointed by the lack of support for Saskatchewan's hometowns.

"Municipalities of Saskatchewan reviewed the platforms that have been made available from several of the parties," said Gordon Barnhart, President of Municipalities of Saskatchewan. "We looked for specific commitments from each party that will continue to make our hometowns healthy and strong."

Municipalities of Saskatchewan reviewed the platforms for the Saskatchewan Party, the Saskatchewan New Democrats, the Progressive Conservative Party, and the Buffalo Party, looking for commitments that would address issues such as maintaining levels of funding, freezing revenue sharing, and continuing the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program.

"Strong Saskatchewan hometowns are critical to our economy now, during COVID-19, and in the future," said President Barnhart. "Continuation of the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program and stable funding through Municipal Revenue Sharing helps foster those strong hometowns. As the provincial election campaigns continue, we will highlight these issues that impact our hometowns directly."
