## Help Expand the Reach of SUMA's 2024 Election Messaging

#### **Emergency Treatment Fund (ETF)**

The federal government announced the launch of the first call for proposals for Health Canada's Emergency Treatment Fund (ETF). The fund will invest \$150 million over 3 years to help municipalities and Indigenous communities deal with mental health and addictions crises in their communities.

The ETF will provide short-term support to rapidly mobilize and build capacity for enhanced access to trauma-informed, evidence-based substance use treatment, harm reduction and integrated services, such as naloxone distribution and drug checking equipment. Funding may also be used to hire a support worker to help residents navigate housing options, as often housing insecurity and mental health and addictions are inextricably linked.

The intention behind the ETF is for to be responsive and adaptive, allowing communities to address their urgent needs in a way that best addresses their unique situation. **Applications will be accepted until November 8 at 2:00 p.m. EST**. 

#### **Natural Infrastructure Webinar**

Discover how natural infrastructure can help tackle flood and drought challenges on the Canadian prairies and the increasing importance of natural infrastructure in managing water resources amidst climate change. The expert panel gathered by IISD (International Institute for Sustainable Development) and Natural Infrastructure on the Canadian Prairies will delve into the dual challenges of flood and drought, exploring how innovative solutions can enhance community resilience.

## SUMA Partner, memoryKPR, Helps Preserve Small Town History

memoryKPR conducted a pilot program helping 48 communities across the province by providing them with tools and knowledge to preserve their history, while also attracting visitors and tourists with their stories and attractions. The pilot project was made possible through Innovation Saskatchewan's Made in Sask technology program, and has provided communities access to speakers and experts in the fields of marketing and economic development.

SUMA began offering election supplies and ballot printing during the 1997 election year. Members can take advantage of our bulk purchasing savings and friendly customer service when preparing for their municipal elections/byelections.

#### **Member Advantages**

- Substantial cost savings, based on bulk purchasing of supplies and bulk processing of ballots.
- Supplies shipped using the most cost effective method for each individual municipality (usually within 3-5 business days of order receipt).
- When the order is received by the SUMA office within 15 business days prior to the advance poll date, guaranteed processing of ballot orders to meet the limited turn-around time between close of nominations, advance poll, and election dates. Orders received less than 15 business days prior to the advance poll date cannot be guaranteed.
- Members will be invoiced directly from SUMA.

## Municipal Administrator's Corner – Election Resources

2024 is a general election year for all municipalities in Saskatchewan. Cities, towns, and villages will hold their general elections on November 13. Northern municipalities have the option to choose from the second last Wednesday in September, the last Wednesday in September, or the first Wednesday in October.

The Advisory Services and Municipal Relations branch has also updated several resources to assist election officials in carrying out their municipal election. The Local Government Election Guide for Saskatchewan municipalities has also been updated and is available to help municipal election officials understand the municipal election process and perform their duties.

## **Election Resources for Citizens Running for Council**

The Ministry of Government Relations, in consultation with the municipal associations (Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities, Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association,

Urban Municipal Administrators Association of Saskatchewan and Rural Municipal Administrators' Association), developed the following resources geared toward citizens who are thinking about running for municipal council:

- <u>Guide Consider Running for Municipal Council</u> A citizen's guide for candidacy in municipal elections.

- Including information in upcoming mailouts of the municipality.

## **Amendments to Municipal Acts and Regulations**

This spring, with the passing of Bill 153, the following three acts were amended:

- The Cities Act
- The Municipalities Act
- The Northern Municipalities Act, 2010

The amendments improved key areas related to assessment appeals, conducting electronic meetings and improved existing processes to ensure consistency across all three acts. Additional changes were made to the regulations for each Act and were passed through Orders in Council 365/2024, 366/2024 and 367/2024 on July 11, 2024.
