Convention 2019: Know Before You Go

Will you be joining us next week at TCU Place in Saskatoon for the 114th Annual SUMA Convention? There's lots going on **February 3 to 6**, so here are some tips to help you make the most of your Convention 2019 experience.

Plan it all out with the help of the agenda on our website, or download our new SUMA Convention app. Use the app to create a personal agenda now and make the most of

your time on location.

Dress for success. Remember that you are representing your community, so dress to put your best foot forward at Convention 2019. Dress is business casual, and make sure you bring warm clothing and comfortable footwear. Saskatoon can be chilly this time of year. The Welcome Reception is casual - wear your favourite jersey - and the President's Banquet is business formal.

Green it up by bringing a reusable water bottle/travel mug, using the clearly identified recycling bins located throughout TCU Place, and taking the bus. **Shuttle service** is provided at all official Convention hotels except for the Holiday Inn Downtown and the Hilton Garden Inn. Look for the SUMA signs in your hotel lobby for the bus stop location and approximate departure times. Schedules are now available on the Convention 2019 page of our website. There will be a listing at the entrance of TCU Place for end-of-day departures.

Get all the goods. Your first stop at TCU Place should be the registration desk, which opens on Sunday at 11:00 a.m. Be sure to line up by *municipality name* (**not** your name). At the registration desk, you'll get an envelope with your name badge, agenda card and event tickets, and a bag with important information items, such as the Convention handbook, which includes resolutions, the tradeshow exhibitor listings, and more.

Wear your name badge at all times during Convention. It is your admission to the tradeshow and all Convention sessions and luncheons with security on-site, and your introduction to fellow delegates.

Socialize. Attend the events that SUMA has to offer! Be sure to bring your tickets to the Welcome Reception on Sunday and the President's Banquet on Tuesday, because you'll be asked for them at the door.

Network. Not to be confused with socializing, networking is all about finding out who's who, sharing what you do, and finding the people who can help you do your job even better. Network with your fellow municipalities as well as the exhibitors in our Municipal Marketplace.

Bring business cards to facilitate making and keeping connections. And what better time to bump up your LinkedIn profile by adding the people you meet from across the province to your network?

Browse the Municipal Marketplace Tradeshow during the dedicated viewing times, or other breaks in your schedule. But remember, entry is restricted to registered delegates and municipal employees only. Make sure you enter your name in our **daily draws** located in the tradeshow area on Sunday and Monday and at the registration desk on Tuesday for your chance to win great prizes.

Borrow great ideas; there's no need to reinvent the wheel! Learn best practices from your fellow municipalities. That's what being a part of an association is all about - sharing.

Be present. Take advantage of the chance to take in education sessions and hear what SUMA is doing for you. When a speaker is presenting, side conversations and ringing cell phones are distracting. Your fellow delegates appreciate your consideration during sessions.

Convention 2019: Get Ready for Resolutions

Prepare for the resolutions session at Convention 2019 by reviewing the resolutions package. This is our chance to get municipal issues in the spotlight with



media and other orders of government.

We encourage members to get familiar with the resolutions and the session procedures to make the most of our time on the Convention floor.

A few highlights from the procedure: All speakers must be both elected officials and Convention 2019 delegates. After the sponsoring community has

seconded their resolution, the chair will ask for speakers opposed or seeking amendments. Unless there is debate on the issue, agreement can be shown through your vote.

- During debate, speakers are limited to two minutes. There will be a clock to show your remaining time, and mics will be silenced when time runs out, so we may move through debate efficiently.
- Sponsoring municipalities get three minutes to second their resolution, and if there is debate, one minute to close.
- If we run out of time at the session, resolutions that did not make it to the floor will be presented to the next meeting of the SUMA Board of Directors.
