Convention 2018: Know Before You Go

Will you be joining us next week at Queensbury Convention Centre in Regina for the 113th Annual SUMA Convention? There's lots going on February 4 to 7, so here are some tips to help you make the most of your Convention 2018 experience.

Plan it all out with the help of the agenda on our website, or our free event app, available for Blackberry, Android, and iPhone/iPad. There's even a web-based version, so you can access the information without downloading the app. Use the app to create a personal agenda now and make the most of your time on location.

Dress for success. Remember that you are representing your community, so dress to put your best foot forward at Convention 2018. Dress is business casual, and make sure you bring warm clothing and comfortable footwear. Regina can be chilly this time of year. Welcome Reception is casual, including your favourite football memorabilia. The President's Banquet is business formal.

Convention 2018: Get Ready for Resolutions

Prepare for the resolutions session at Convention 2018 by reviewing the resolutions package. This is our chance to get municipal issues in the spotlight with media and other orders of government, but with 23 resolutions this year, we encourage members to get familiar with the resolutions and the session procedures to make the most of our limited time on the Convention floor.

A few highlights from the procedure:

- All speakers must be both elected officials and Convention 2018 delegates.
- After the sponsoring community has seconded their resolution, the chair will ask for speakers opposed or seeking amendments. Unless there is debate on the issue, agreement can be shown through your vote.
- During debate, speakers are limited to two minutes.
 There will be a clock to show your remaining time,
 and mics will be silenced when time runs out, so we
 may move through debate efficiently.
- Sponsoring municipalities get three minutes to second their resolution, and if there is debate, one minute to close.
- If we run out of time at the session, resolutions that did not make it to the floor will be presented to the next meeting of the SUMA Board of Directors.

Webinar on New Energy Star Certification Program

Soon, eligible commercial and institutional buildings in Canada will be able to show residents their structures are energy efficient by displaying Energy Star symbols. Does your municipality have an energy-efficient curling or ice rink? You can apply. How about a residential care facility? It could also be eligible. Seven building types are currently eligible:

- curling and ice rinks;
- senior care communities and residential care facilities;
- medical offices;
- schools;
- hospitals;
- commercial offices; and
- supermarket and food stores.

Capacity Building: Asset Management Certificate Course

Do you want to learn about asset management and how it could help save your municipality money **and** make the most out of municipal infrastructure? Would you like to gain the skills to create or update an asset management plan for your municipality?

The National Asset Management Strategy Canada (NAMS Canada) is partnering with the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) to offer an <u>online asset management certificate course.</u> Sign up by **March 30** for the eight-week course, running from April to June 2018. The cost is only \$215, so sign up soon to get one of the limited spots.

Though the course is beneficial to municipalities of all sizes, it is geared to those with populations of less than 10,000 people and with limited expertise in asset management. Your municipality does not need to be an FCM member to register.
