Funding: Community Airports

The Government of Saskatchewan is now accepting applications for the Community Airport Partnership (CAP) Program until **March 31, 2018**.

Eligible applicants include municipal or community owned airports that support safety, economic and social development, general access to surrounding communities, and air ambulance operations. Communities are encouraged to partner with other communities, RMs and businesses in their proposal.

SUMA has long advocated for sustainable funding for community airports. In 2010, the SUMA Board of Directors endorsed a policy advocating for additional funding for airport infrastructure in southern Saskatchewan. The CAP has since received a much-needed boost to continue building links between Saskatchewan and national and international markets. Please take advantage of this program for your regional community airport.

CAP is an ongoing program subject to the availability of funding on an annual basis. Half (50 per cent) of the eligible cost is available for funding, with a maximum contribution of \$275,000, for an approved project.
