AIMM to Stop the Spread of Invasive Mussels

Municipalities, residents and cottage owners are being encouraged to help fight against invasive mussels by monitoring Saskatchewan's lakes and waterways.

Invasive mussels such as zebra and quagga mussels pose a serious threat to lakes and waterways in western Canada. The mussels are almost impossible to eliminate once they become established, and they have the potential to harm aquatic habitats, fisheries, recreational resources and water-related infrastructure.

To prevent the spread of invasive mussels in the province, municipalities, community organizations, business groups

<u>Town of Grenfell: Superintendent of</u> <u>Public Works</u> (When filled) and residents are being asked to participate in the 2018 Saskatchewan Adult Invasive Mussel Monitoring (AIMM) Program.

AIMM includes three types of monitoring:

- watching for invasive mussels attached to structures like docks, water intake pipes or anchors;
- inspecting the shoreline, examining natural elements and rocks; and
- using aquatic invasive samplers that are placed in the water in June and checked monthly for invasive mussels.

There were no confirmed sightings of invasive mussels in the 90 Saskatchewan waterbodies sampled in <u>2017</u> <u>through AIMM</u>, but the mussels have been found in Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec and 34 states including North Dakota, Minnesota and Montana.
