PST Impact Survey

Has your hometown been financially impacted by the addition of PST to construction services?

The 2017-18 provincial budget added PST to services including construction, agriculture, and life and health insurance. On February 26, Premier Moe announced the reinstatement of PST exemptions on life and health insurance premiums, as well as agriculture. However, PST remains on services including construction.

To analyze how PST on construction has affected Saskatchewan's hometowns, SUMA has created a short, <u>three question survey</u>. The survey will be open until **March 21**.

Community Safety Officer Program

Registration is now open for the April 30 to June 8 round of <u>Community Safety Officer Program Induction Training</u> at Saskatchewan Polytechnic, Prince Albert. The registration deadline is **April 13**, and tuition is \$5,710.

Community Safety Officers (CSOs) provide an additional option to enhance community safety, and support local policing agencies by addressing high priority, but low risk to harm concerns. The program training must be done before a CSO may be granted a Special Constable Appointment, which allows the enforcement of some provincial statutes.
