Reminder: Changes to LA FOIP

Do you know about the changes to The Local Authority Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (LA FOIP)?

Proclaimed amendments to the LA FOIP came into effect **January 1, 2018**. Some of the amendments include requiring local authorities to help applicants get information and a duty to protect personal information, extending LA FOIP to include police services, increasing the penalties for offences, and creating a new offence for snooping.

Funding: Low Carbon Economy Challenge

Does your community have an ingenious idea to help reduce greenhouse gas emissions? Your project could be eligible for funding through the Government of Canada's Low Carbon Economy Challenge.

A total of \$500 million in funding is being awarded for Canadian ingenuity to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and generate clean growth in support of Canada's clean growth and climate action plan.

The challenge is broken into two streams. The Champions stream will provide \$450 million in funding to all eligible applicants, including municipalities of all sizes. Apply before the **May 14 deadline**.

The second stream is limited to Indigenous communities and organizations, small and medium-sized businesses,

- anger;
- sadness;
- increased use of alcohol or drugs;
- suicidal thoughts;
- financial worries;
- legal questions; and
- family concerns.

EFAP is dedicated to supporting volunteer members and their families with 24/7/365 services.

AIMM to Stop Invasive Mussels

Help stop the spread of invasive mussels with the <u>2018</u> <u>Saskatchewan Adult Invasive Mussel Monitoring (AIMM)</u> <u>Program</u>.

Invasive mussels such as zebra and quagga mussels pose a serious threat to lakes and waterways in western Canada.

There were no confirmed sightings of invasive mussels in 90 Saskatchewan waterbodies sampled in 2017, but the mussels have been found in Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec, and 34 states including North Dakota, Minnesota and Montana.

AIMM is designed to stop the spread of the pesky mollusks in Saskatchewan.
