## Process for review of 2012 Census Population and Dwelling Counts

On February 8, 2012 Statistics Canada released the 2011 census population and dwelling counts. If your council is concerned the data being provided by Statistics Canada is incorrect, a formal review can be requested. The deadline to submit a request for a formal review is December 31, 2012.

## Second payment out for the 2011 Municipal Recycling Bridge Funding Program

On March 29, SUMA sent out the second payment for the 2011 Bridge Funding program.

Your second payment was based on the tonnage of paper and cardboard recycled between July and December 2011, calculated at \$24.83 per metric tonne.

This officially concludes the 2011-2012 program.

## Multi-Material Recycling Program (MMRP) Datacall

The Ministry of Environment has contracted StewardEdge for another round of recycling datacall. This datacall is designed to gather baseline information needed for the implementation of the MMRP next year. Accurate data is essential because it will determine the volume of waste produced; subsequently, the volume will be used to calculate financial support for the program.
