\$46 Million for Infrastructure in Western Canada

Last week, Western Economic Diversification Canada announced they will invest more than \$46 million in infrastructure for Western Canada. The funds will come through a new two-year national program, the Community Infrastructure Improvement Fund. The program will invest in rehabilitation and improvement of existing community infrastructure.

Provincial and territorial ministers responsible for municipal governments had a united message going into last week's meeting in Kananaskis, Alberta: there needs to be a new federal long-term infrastructure plan and funding program.

"Saskatchewan is seeing unprecedented growth and prosperity and we need to ensure that the right infrastructure is in place now and in the years to come to maintain this momentum," said Government Relations Minister Jim Reiter. FCM Workshop: Municipal Campaign Training for Women Regina - July 28 and 29

While women make up over 52 per cent of the Canadian population, only 25 per cent of the country's elected municipal representatives are female. Canada ranks 42nd out of 189 countries for the number of women in politics.

Karen Leibovici, president of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) and councillor for the City of Edmonton, announced a two-day workshop in Regina aimed at helping women overcome the obstacles they face in running for municipal office. The workshop will be held July 28 and 29.

The workshop will cover a wide range of topics, including: deciding to run, financing the campaign, campaign ethics, canvassing, public speaking, and media training.


