Strengthen Local Government Leadership This Fall

The fall sessions of the Municipal Leadership Development Program (MLDP) are now open for registrations. The MLDP is a series of six modules, or workshops, that target specific issues of importance to northern, rural and urban municipalities. Mayors, reeves, councillors and municipal staff can all benefit from the program.

On top of the 10 sessions offered in November, the Municipal Leaders Roles and Responsibilities module will be held the Sunday before the SUMA convention in Saskatoon. Registration information for the Sunday, February 3, 2013 session will be available later this fall.
