seeking feedback on the recent changes to *The Local Government Election Act*. The Ministry wants to know whether you encountered any difficulties in administering any of the new provisions, and whether you have suggestions for further refinements from your recent experience using the new provisions.

Specific areas of interest are:

- voter identification;
- vouching;
- mail-in ballots;
- voters' lists; and
- urban and rural provisions/differences: In the next set of amendments to the Act, the Ministry would like to consider whether it is feasible to consolidate the urban and rural provisions on any particular topic or election matter into the same section of the Act. The Ministry has heard this may be desirable given the many cases of joint administration of urban and rural municipalities.

SUMA encourages all members to participate in this consultation as your feedback will determine whether any changes are needed before the next municipal election in 2016.

SWEEP will support your event by supplying promotion and marketing material, packaging and logistics.

SWEEP can also support your awareness campaigns by providing free items as brochures that could be distributed through usual municipal mailings. SWEEP wants to partner with you in other ways to inform your residents and businesses of issues in Saskatchewan communities and rural municipalities with populations of less than 40,000.

This event is a great opportunity for municipal leaders to discuss best practices, co-operative solutions and the benefits of asset management and financial planning. The agenda includes presentations not only from a local and provincial perspective but from a national perspective as well.
