The Government of Saskatchewan announced the 2013 Emergency Flood Damage Reduction Program last week. The program will provide engineering and technical assistance to municipalities, while sharing the cost of flood prevention works - both permanent and temporary.

Level of coverage varies depending on the work, from 50 to 100 per cent. Projects must be approved by the Saskatchewan Water Security Agency to qualify for funding. You can call the nearest Water Security Agency office or 1-866-727-5420 to request assistance through the program.



# Provincial Legislation Changing to Impose Regional Planning

Last week, the provincial government introduced amendments to *The Planning and Development Act, 2007* that will allow the Minister of Government Relations to impose regional planning authorities. Where municipalities are unable to agree on joint regional planning priorities, the province could step in and create regional planning authorities with representatives from affected municipalities and the province.
