Infrastructure Survey

The Government of Canada announced the New Building

Canada Plan, a renewed infrastructure program in their 2013 budget. They are working with the provinces on the program parameters and cost-sharing allocations for the new Building Canada Fund. This is an important process to ensure funding is properly allocated.

SUMA needs to know how you think the funding should be allocated. Please <u>complete our survey</u> to tell us which options you would support for the new Building Canada Fund. This information will help us finalize details with the province.

Upcoming Deadline for Bridge Funding Program

The deadline to submit documentation for the second round of the 2013 Municipal Recycling Bridge Funding Program is fast approaching. SUMA must receive all documentation by Wednesday, February 19, 2014. A complete submission includes a Receipt Submission Form and actual tonnage information from July 2013 to December 2013. Remember, you must submit all of this information by the deadline to receive the \$150 bonus payment. Late and incomplete submissions will be ineligible to receive the bonus payment. Please also note that the program only reimburses for paper and cardboard recycled in 2013.
