Have Your Say: Building Code Consultation

SUMA has been asked to consult on a potential alternate model for complying with The Uniform Building and Accessibilities Standards Act and its regulations. Under the new model, owners contracting an architect and/or engineer for their project could choose to have that contractor fill out a declaration letter stating that the building complies with the building code, rather than having an independent building inspector attend the site and perform a formal inspection.

Convention 2016:Registration Opens Next Month

Did You Know...

Along with an official <u>tartan</u>, mineral (potash), animal (white-tailed deer), tree (white birch), bird (sharp-tailed grouse), flower (red lily) and sport (curling), Saskatchewan has an official provincial grass. Needle-and-thread grass was designated Saskatchewan's official grass in 2001. The grass is so named thanks to the shape of its seeds: They are sharply pointed and have fibres that mimic the appearance of thread.
