Act quickly if you want to attend the ticketed evening activities at Convention 2016! Deadline to request your tickets is **Wednesday, January 27**.



2016-17 Community Airport Partnership Program

SUMA has long advocated for sustainable funding for community airports. In 2010, the SUMA Board of Directors endorsed a policy advocating for additional funding for airport infrastructure in southern Saskatchewan. The Community Airport Partnership (CAP) program has since received a much-needed boost to continue building links between Saskatchewan and national and international markets. Please take advantage of this program for your regional community airport. Our members identified the renewal of this program as a priority, and so we want to make sure that all of the available money gets used.

Eligible community airports apply for an infrastructure grant. If recommended by a review panel of aviation experts, a project is cost-shared 50/50 between the community and the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure (MHI) to a maximum contribution by MHI of \$275,000. The deadline for CAP applications is **Thursday, March 31, 2016**. Applications received after this date will not be considered. See the <u>CAP Program and Application Guidelines</u> for more information.

This is your last week to make your payment for your 2016 SUMA membership ahead of the January 31, 2016 deadline. You can even bring your payment to Convention 2016, if you wish.
