SUMA Remembers Past President

Davey Steuart 1916-2010

It is with sadness that SUMA has learned of the passing of David "Davey" Steuart this past weekend at the age of 94.



Steuart was a well known politician within the province of Saskatchewan. In 1951 he was elected to city council in Prince Albert where he served for almost a decade. He served two years as the mayor of that city and also as President of the Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association from 1958 - 1959. During his tenure on city council Steuart was instrumental in developing a district planning model involving the two neighbouring RMs. Davey's vision was to maintain a harmonious and cooperative land use planning process to sustain both rural and urban interests. To date, the Prince Albert District Planning Commission remains one of the strongest models of inter-municipal cooperation on the Prairies.

Following his municipal service, Steuart became the Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA) for Prince Albert in a by-election in 1962. When the Liberal government of Ross Thatcher was elected in 1964, Steuart was appointed Minister of Health. He went on to be Minister of Natural Resources where he focused on developing the potash industry in Saskatchewan. In 1965, he was appointed Deputy- Premier and later became leader of the provincial Liberal Party in 1971.

Steuart was appointed to the Senate in December of 1976 by then Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau. He served in the Senate for fifteen years until his retirement in 1991. He passed Nov. 5 in Kelowna.

Easier applications with new online Green Municipal Fund forms

Wondering whether your initiative may be eligible for Green Municipal Fund (GMF) funding? Save time and effort by taking the [Self-Screening Questionnaire](#) prior to applying. This determines whether the project has the prerequisites and supporting documentation needed to complete an application.

The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) has also released its online application form, a fillable PDF with clearer, simpler questions, auto-calculation functions, drop down lists and more yes/no questions.

The form includes a suite of mandatory and optional environmental indicators to help assess the environmental benefits of an initiative, and help text for more information.

The new [GMF Application Form](#) is your gateway to FCM's updated funding offer for capital projects (including increases to funding available, broader eligibility requirements and improved access to GMF funding).


