Municipal Infrastructure Lending Program

The Municipal Infrastructure Lending Program (MILP) is designed to provide municipalities with low-cost 15-year loans to fund housing-related infrastructure. These funds are meant to decrease the cost of borrowing for municipalities and can also be used as the municipal portion of a

cost-sharing grant program application (i.e. this loan can be used as the municipal 1/3 share for a BCF application).

SGI unveils new one-part driver's licenses

Customers will soon be receiving the new Saskatchewan driver's licenses. Minister responsible for SGI Tim McMillan unveiled the new one-part license today. The license includes elements that meet international standards similar to those used on passports and currency.

The new licenses will replace the current two-part licenses, which have a photo ID card and paper certificate. It will also have a longer renewal period, with customers renewing every five years, instead of annually.

Eligible costs include planning, designing, construction, costs for professionals, decontamination, materials, legal services, land costs, environmental assessment, and interest on interim financing. Loan sizes vary according to project.

Applications can be completed online on an on-going basis. All loans must be fully advanced by March 31, 2011. Construction on all projects must be completed by March 31, 2012.
