Woodlands County: Director, Infrastructure Services (02/28/11) participate in the SaskPower Self-Generated Electricity Project for Rinks. Due to overwhelming interest in the project,

SaskPower is doubling the number of project sites to better explore the economic and environmental benefits of self-generated power projects at municipal ice rinks.



Under the new terms of the project, wind turbines will be installed at four community rinks in Saskatchewan. The performance of these turbines will be monitored for up to five years to determine if self-generating electricity can help offset the power bills in the selected rinks. The turbines are expected to be installed and operational by mid-2011.

Interested communities must download and complete the Municipal Expression of Interest Form at saskpower.com/rinks. Rinks meeting the Expression of Interest criteria - including being located in one of the two qualifying wind energy zones - will be provided a proposal package, which must be returned to SaskPower by March 4, 2011. The original deadline for proposals was January 31, 2011. The successful communities will be announced in April.

Communities that have already applied for the project do not need to reapply. However, municipalities wishing to submit an updated proposal are welcome to do so, but are encouraged to first contact the SaskPower Municipal Ice Rink Program manager. Capital costs for the demonstration project will be funded by SaskPower, including the purchase, installation and maintenance costs of the turbines for up to five years.
