New Health Funding Formula is Proof Province Listening to Urban Governments

"Today's announcement by Minister McMorris is good news for all Saskatchewan residents," said Allan Earle, President of SUMA. "SUMA has always made the case that health is a provincial interest, and should be fully provincially funded. The new funding formula allows cities, towns and villages to use a greater portion of property tax revenue for its intended use: to provide municipal services such as safe drinking water, effective public safety, waste management, roads and sidewalks, and transit."

"At the SUMA convention, Minister Hickie and Minster McMorris both acknowledged that the province is willing to act when urban governments make a good case to advance their interests," Earle said. "This announcement is proof positive of their words. SUMA advanced this position in its budget submission to the province, and today we see the province delivered."

In recent years Saskatchewan's urban governments have partnered with the provincial government on matters of mutual interest. This relationship emerged because of the recognition that local urban actions impact the province's economy and vice versa. The constructive and respectful government-to-government relationship which now exists between the two orders of government is essential to making sure Saskatchewan

The first, announced during the SUMA convention in early February, is that the provincial government has promised a comprehensive housing strategy by the end of June, 2011. Working with industry shareholders, municipal leaders and other organizations, the government will try to find ways to augment the current affordable housing system, as well as to encompass the full range of housing in the province. remove barriers and increase the number of homes being built in Saskatchewan.

The second is an announcement made by the provincial government February 18 that nearly \$34 million in new funding for affordable housing has been made available.

The money will go toward the development of more affordable rental housing in more than 100 communities with a long-term housing need, and rejuvenating government-funded housing across Saskatchewan.

The news release said that more details about specific projects will be announced in the coming weeks.
