# PDAP Changes Will Expedite Process

Changes to the provincial Disaster Assistance

out of Edmonton to build a logical understanding of what sustainability would look like in each of the categories in the various types of municipalities in the province. We have identified a number of measures that we think will indicate where a municipal corporation, like you, might fit on a simple spectrum from "highly" sustainable to "challenged" in sustainability.

The next step in the project is to test these measures using real data from test municipalities. We would really like you to participate in this process.

We know how busy that you are, but we feel that this is a very worthwhile venture for you to participate in. You will be asked to complete a data collection worksheet. This worksheet will be in Excel 2003 and will list all of the measures identified in the eight areas of sustainability. For each measure, you will need to provide a response. Depending on the measure, theresponse may be yes, no or a number (this may be something that you formally track or an estimate based on your knowledge of the municipality). Some of the measures will come from data already reported to Municipal Affairs. We will put that into the worksheet for you. We think that it will take about two to three hours to complete the worksheet. The time required will vary depending on whether you need to locate and review records or consult with others in your organization.

Your responses will not be identified to Municipal Affairs or any other of the participants. The report to the project team from the consultant will remove the names of the municipalities and describe you only by characteristics such as size, location or type. The data will allow Acton to conduct a statistical analysis of the measures to test the relevancy and availability of data within municipalities.
