

FCM - Launching election campaign platform and website

The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) is launching its federal campaign platform and website this week.

The website will include platform information, important updates and tools to help people become involved in the campaign. Included will be debate questions for local candidates' debates and town halls.

In the interim, FCM has included below key messages you may find useful when responding to local media questions until the platform launch.

Key messages:

- 1. In the last few years, all federal political parties in Ottawa have come to realize why Canadian cities and communities matter. During this election campaign, they need to show Canadians they will continue to act on it. All parties need to use these lean years to prepare the country for the future. They need to make cities and communities a top economic priority by:
 - declaring war on traffic gridlock, so people can get to work and home again without wasting time sitting bumper to bumper;
 - fixing a housing system that leaves too
