Sask Municipal Award Winners

Saskatchewan communities are trend leaders in projects using innovation and enterprise. On May 13, the annual Saskatchewan Municipal Awards ceremony celebrated some of the best and brightest of these, including environmentally friendly improvements for recreational facilities; engaging youth; taking pride in preserving the past; employing municipal cooperation to create a joint sanitation system; and finding common interests in improving healthcare services through providing a residence for doctors and students.

\$700,000 CAP Grants Announced

Highways and Infrastructure Minister Jim Reiter today announced the 11 eligible community airports that will share the \$700,000 available for this year's provincial costshared infrastructure grants for projects like runway improvements.

"We've increased the province's investment by 40 per cent for this grant program so more can be Village of Hazlet - Wind Powered Rink Complex The rink complex was facing rising power costs, shorter rink seasons and was starting to increase rink fees substantially to cover the costs. The Village of Hazlet recognized the increasing power costs and importance of the rink complex to the community and came up with the idea to install an artificial ice plant powered by a wind turbine. In order to counter the extra cost of power for the plant, the village received funding from the Recreational Infrastructure Canada program and is the first of its kind in Saskatchewan.

Regional Leadership and Partnerships Award: Towns of Rosthern, Hague, Duck Lake and Waldheim, RMs of Duck Lake No. 463, Rosthern No. 403, and Laird No. 404, and Villages of Hepburn and Laird -Doctor/Medical Professionals' Residence In response to a request from local physicians that the community invest in a living quarters for nursing, medical and lab technicians students, the nine municipalities partnered together to renovate the historic Rosthern Post Office into a residence for medical professionals.

<u>Community Development Leadership Award:</u> Town of Kindersley - Kindersley Youth Council

In October 2009, the Kindersley Youth Council was established, along with the creation of a part-time Culture and Youth Coordinator position to facilitate work with the junior council. Made up of seven members (six councillors and one youth mayor), the Youth Council was intended to be a means with which to expose youth to municipal governance, encourage leadership, and promote increased community participation and volunteerism.

Environmental Stewardship Award: Town of Dundurn, RM of Dundurn No. 314, and Resort Villages of Thode and Shields - Joint Sanitary Sewer System

This project provides a sanitary sewer system jointly owned and operated by four municipalities and provides a sewer system to a Hutterite Colony and 180 acreage sites in the rural municipality.

<u>Heritage Conservation Leadership</u>: City of Humboldt -Humboldt's Heritage Values

The museum board had identified several heritage issues as a result of a community analysis conducted during its strategic planning process. Among the issues identified in the analysis was the need for a plan for overall heritage and cultural development for the city. The first step was to develop a heritage policy, which was approved in 2008 as part of the City's Official Community Plan.

done to improve airport infrastructure," Reiter said. "Community airports are important to our economy as they are used by the energy and mining sectors and also provide vital air ambulance service to Saskatchewan residents." The grants are through the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure's Community Airports Partnership (CAP) program and are equally matched by eligible recipients, which means up to \$1.4 million is expected to be invested by the end of the fiscal year. Airports that will receive the grants (which will be matched by the communities that own the airports), amounts and planned projects are: Estevan, \$103,000, to repair runway cracks and pave aprons; **RM of Frontier**, \$24,000, to rehabilitate runway and tarmac; Kindersley, \$7,500, to seal apron cracks; Kipling, \$31,000, to seal runway cracks; Maple Creek, \$20,000, to install a global positioning system (GPS); Moose Jaw, \$35,000, to seal runway cracks, upgrade apron and taxiway lighting; North Battleford, \$37,500, for major crack repairs; Rosetown, \$47,000, to install runway lighting; **Shaunavon**, \$25,000, for an Automated Weather Observing System (AWOS); Weyburn, \$197,000, to

recap part of one runway and to completely recap main runway; and **Yorkton**, \$173,000, for runway and taxiway repairs, runway lighting and drainage rehabilitation.

"It's wonderful to see the province increase the funding and recognize aviation's important role," Saskatchewan Aviation Council President Janet Keim said. "We also appreciate the support we've seen for this program from various communities, as they see the value of this transportation sector to their local economies."

This is the first time CAP funding has increased since the program began in 2007. By the end of the current fiscal year when combining ministry and applicant funds, up to \$4.8 million will be invested in 23 communities for airport rehabilitation over five years.

Building & Fire Code Change Info Meetings

September 1, 2011, Saskatchewan will be adopting the 2010 National Building Code of Canada (NBC) and the 2010 National Fire Code of Canada (NFC), with few amendments.

The NBC is adopted as the minimum standard for the construction and renovation of buildings. The NFC is adopted as the minimum standard for the fire safe operations of buildings. Both standards apply throughout the province.

The 2010 editions of the NBC and NFC will replace all earlier editions.

The Ministry of Corrections, Public Safety and Policing, Building Standards Unit (BSU) is responsible for reviewing these Codes and

preparing for their adoption. Information sessions will be hosted the BSU for building owners, industry, building officials, the fire service and other code users as follows.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

FCC Agri-Spirit Canada

The FCC AgriSpirit Fund is about making life better for people in rural communities. This year, FCC will provide \$1 million to support rural capital projects across Canada. We award between \$5,000 and \$25,000 for capital community improvement projects such as emergency services equipment, playgrounds, recreation centres and care homes in communities with populations fewer than 100,000.

Registered charities, municipal bodies and non-profit organizations that partner with municipal bodies are eligible for funding. Eligible organizations that are interested in applying for funding this year are encouraged to apply online from May 9 to June 20 at <u>www.agrispirit.ca</u>, where you can find complete information and eligibility criteria.

P3 Canada RFP for Municipal Infrastructure Projects

Recently, P3 Canada launched its third request for proposals for potential P3 municipal infrastructure projects. P3 Canada is the federal agency tasked with administering the Government of Canada's \$1.25-billion Public-Private Partnership (P3) Fund.

This fund remains one of the few federal funding envelopes still available to municipalities for near-term infrastructure investment. Federal stimulus programs are winding down. And, at present, FCM is working with the Government of Canada to develop a long-term infrastructure plan and renew the existing Building Canada Fund when it expires in 2014.

Eligible infrastructure projects can receive up to 25 per cent of the direct cost of construction for a P3 project. The partnership fund has already supported 68 projects across the country. More than one-half of these projects were municipal initiatives, including water and wastewater
