Reminder: StatsCan National Household Survey important for municipalities!

In addition to the 2011 Census, Statistics Canada has begun collecting the National Household Survey, a voluntary replacement for the previous mandatory long-form census.

The information collected by the NHS is very important to YOU and your residents. It helps communities determine how and where to spend their federal transfer payment, and helps businesses build a profile of their customers, among many other things. The voluntary nature of the NHS means that we are counting on the support of communities, chambers and associations to help us promote the survey from the standpoint of why it is important to YOU and your community.

Culex Tarsalis development progressing

Culex Tarsalis numbers are on the rise, most advanced in the province's southeast, but still behind 2010 levels. The recent hot weather has meant that the accumulated degree-day heat units are now approaching normal levels throughout most of Saskatchewan, and this, combined with the standing water from increased precipitation, means that both large numbers of nuisance mosquitos and Culex Tarsalis (carrier of West Nile Virus) mosquitos are on the rise.

2011 Municipal Recycling Bridge Funding Program Website online

We are pleased to announce that the <u>Bridge Funding website</u> has been updated.

All the information you need, including the declaration and receipt submission forms, can be found on the website. As a reminder, the submission deadline for the first payment is July 28, 2011. The first payment is based on the actual tonnage for the January to June 2011 period. The rate for the first payment is \$25.00 per MT. In order to receive your funds, we require the following documentation:

- · Declaration Form;
- · January-June 2011 tonnage receipts; and
- · January-June 2011 Receipt Submission Form.

Only municipalities that received bridge funding in 2010 are eligible for this year's program. Please note that we are not accepting new program participants.
