Streamlined Review and Approval Process for Flood Damage Repair

In response to the extensive flooding that has occurred across Saskatchewan in the spring and summer of 2011, Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) and The Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment (ENV), in consultation with the Saskatchewan Ministry of Corrections Public Safety and Policing, have been working to provide a coordinated, streamlined review and approval process for repairs to flood-impacted municipal infrastructure.

To read the Aquatic Habitat Protection Permit and cover letter, shoreline stabilization protocols and standard mitigations for bridge repair or replacement, and package outlining DFO requirements for work in and around fish-bearing

Twinning can help nurture economic opportunities

One of the sessions at the FCM conference this past June examined how municipal twinning can help nurture economic opportunities. For more information on what a municipal twinning arrangement is and how to establish one, The Saskatchewan Ministry of Municipal Affairs has a resource that could help.

Also, one of SUMA's sister associations, the Union of British Columbia Municipalities, has co-produced a twinning toolkit which includes sections on maximizing the potential of the arrangement, measuring progress, and profiles of existing arrangements.

Incidentally, our research to date suggests that six Saskatchewan towns and cities have municipal twinning arrangements. If your village, town, or city is twinned, SUMA's policy research assistant would like to hear from you. You can e-mail Shannon at policy@suma.org.
