# Volunteer Firefighters Tax Benefits

SUMA recently received a letter from the Canadian Minister of Finance regarding the tax treatment of volunteer firefighters.

The 2011 Federal budget proposes a 15 per cent nonrefundable Volunteer Firefighter Tax Credit on an amount of \$3000 for volunteer firefighters who perform at least 200 hours of service annually.

Minister Flaherty also said the Income Tax Act exempts the first \$1,000 in honoraria provided by municipalities to these volunteers, and permits all out-of-pocket expenses incurred by volunteers to be reimbursed on a non-taxable basis.

He concluded that eligible volunteer firefighters who receive honoraria in respect for their duties as volunteer firefighters will be able to choose between the new tax credit and the existing \$1,000 exemption for honoraria.
