FCM Study Shows Economic Growth, Immigrants Linked Inseparably

A recent report by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities underlines the need for municipalities to have a formal role in developing federal immigration policies. "Starting on Solid Ground - Municipalities and Immigration" describes urban government as the "front-line first responders for many immigrants' needs", and describes the effect locally delivered services may have on immigrants and temporary workers.

In speaking with the media, FCM president Berry Vrbanovic said that currently, federal and provincial initiatives are not meeting immigrants' needs.

The report brings to light five recommendations, including expanding settlement/immigration services to a longer period, setting clear targets for successful immigrant settlement, recognizing municipalities as key stakeholders, increasing the supply of affordable housing stock and investing to improve public transit.
