The Federal Framework: What We Know

- Senate to have third reading by June 7, 2018
- Possession limits (30g)
- Criminalizes more than 5g possession for minors
- Allows for limited home cultivation
- Licenses private producers and looks after supply chain
- Severely limits advertising and display, particularly around minors
- Edibles and concentrates by one-year anniversary of legislation date

The Provincial Framework: What We Know

- 19 Years old for consumption
- Prohibits any cannabis possession by minors
- Private producers, processors, wholesalers, and retailers
- Products subject to federal excise tax, GST, and PST
- No public consumption
- Zero tolerance model for impaired driving





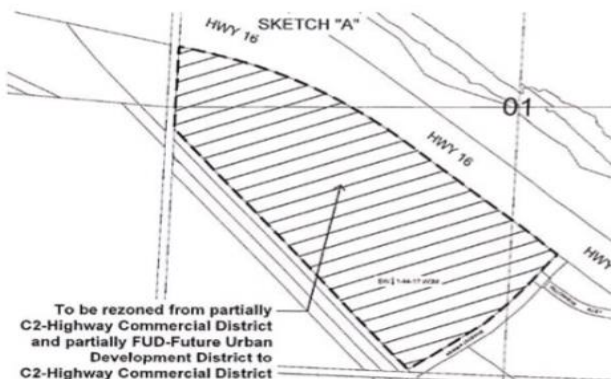
TOWN OF BATTLEFORD PUBLIC NOTICE

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Town of Battleford intends to adopt a bylaw under the *Planning and Development Act, 2007* to amend Bylaw No. 7-2016 known as the Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT

The proposed bylaw amendment will:

- Add new definitions for "Cannabis Grow Operation" and "Cannabis Retail store";
- Add discretionary use criteria and general regulations for Cannabis Grow Operations, similar to those for warehouses and freight handling facilities
- Add general regulations for Cannabis Retail Stores that require them to be situated at least 150 metres away from any school or playground
- Add sign regulations for Cannabis Retail Stores and Cannabis Grow Operations that restrict the use of images on signs;
- Provide the ability for the Town to apply landscaping requirements to a portion of a site when it will be developed in phases over time;
- Add Cannabis Retail Stores as a discretionary use in the C1-Downtown Commercial District and as a permitted use in the C2- Highway Commercial District;
- Add Cannabis Grow Operations as a discretionary use in the C2-Highway Commercial District; and
- Rezone Surface Parcels 148893609, 203238468 and 203238424 from partially C2-Highway Commercial District and partially FUD - Future Urban Development District to C2-Highway Commercial District and shown on Sketch "A".



REASON

The reason for the amendment is;

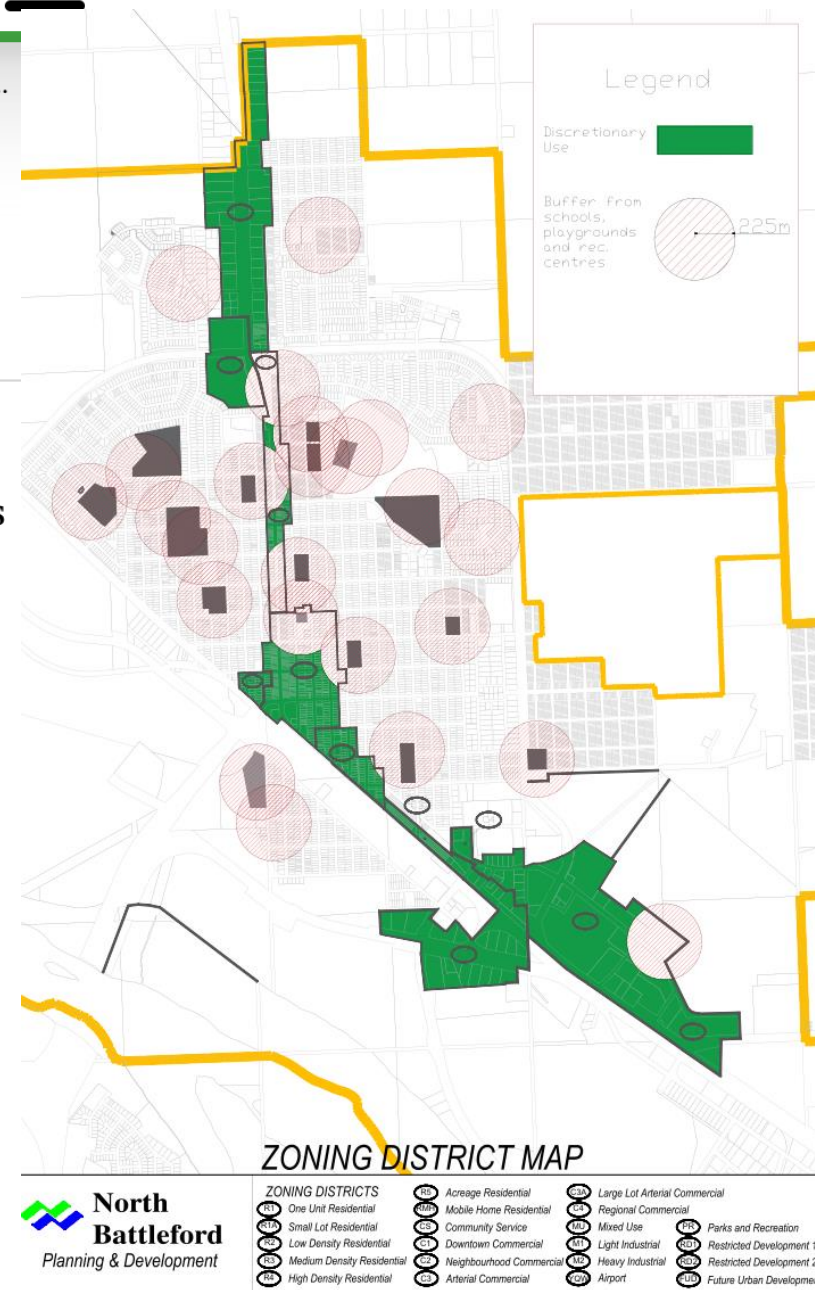

A Note on Medicinal Cannabis

- The *Access to Cannabis for Medical Purposes Regulations* does not allow access to cannabis for through retail cannabis dispensaries
- The ACMPR allows three ways to access medicinal cannabis:
 - Register with licensed producers
 - Register with Health Canada to produce a limited amount
 - Designate someone else to produce the limited amount
