Asset Management, Policing on Agenda for Hometowns in Central Saskatchewan

Municipal leaders from 15 hometowns in central Saskatchewan gathered at Dakota Dunes October 1 to discuss the matters important to their communities.

The topics of asset management and policing dominated the conversation at the Central Regional Meeting hosted by the Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA).

"Our hometown infrastructure delivers the services that residents rely on every day, from providing safe drinking water to offering spaces for sport and recreation," said Lee Finishen, Central Regional Director and councillor for the Town of Fort Qu'Appelle. "Asset management is essential to making the most out of this infrastructure."

On policing, municipal leaders discussed the cost and level of services being received by Saskatchewan hometowns.

Representatives also received updates on topics including cannabis legalization, vehicle for hire regulations, and multi-material recycling.

The Central Regional Meeting is one of seven regional meetings being hosted by SUMA from September 26 – October 4.

"Regional meetings are an opportunity for municipal officials to discuss challenges and share ideas with fellow leaders from their region," said SUMA President Gordon Barnhart.
